Pastor's Letter

What does it mean to be a *member* of a church? I don't know if you have ever been asked or asked yourself this question, but it is an important one for each of us to ponder. "Membership in the Church of Jesus Christ is a joy and a privilege. It is also a commitment to participate in Christ's mission. A faithful member bears witness to God's love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ's Church." (BoO, G-1.0304).

Many aspects of being part of our church are open to anyone, regardless of membership status. Anyone can attend worship, sing in the choir, take Communion, teach a class, share joys and concerns, request and receive pastoral care, attend fellowship events, and volunteer to help with special events. What further benefits could there possibly be for those who are members?

I would say there are 2 reasons for becoming a member of the church, one of which is practical, and relates to our Presbyterian structure of church governance; the other is theological, which is important to our self-understanding as a community of faith. I will address the latter first, as I believe it applies more universally to all who are among our community.

Membership in any group signifies to yourself, to the group, and to the larger community that you are willingly identify yourself with them. You choose to belong, and you seek the group's recognition of your belonging. Susan Andrews describes 3 C's of Church Membership: Covenant, Commitment, and Community.

1. **Covenant.** Throughout the Bible God says to us, *I will be your God and you will be my people—no matter what.* God's covenant with us becomes the model for our human covenants, our promises to be loving and faithful and constant in all our relationships. Church membership is our primary covenant response to God's dependable presence in our lives."

2. **Commitment.** Just as God stays connected to us no matter what, we are called through church membership to stay connected to God faithfully,


regularly, permanently—in good times and bad. It is only through long-term commitment and disciplined participation that membership can root us in what is really important in our faith.

3. **Community.** The apostle Paul envisions the church as the body of Christ, an interconnected, interdependent, integrated community of believers. Our covenant commitment is not just with God but with one another. As church members we admit our need for others and their need for us. We are at our best as Christians when we are together, committing to the covenant community of the body of Christ.

Practically speaking, membership allows a person to vote in congregational meetings (we usually have 2-3 each year) and to serve as a church officer. Our Session consists of 9 ruling elders, and we have a Board of Deacons made up of 6 deacons. Any member of the church may be nominated to serve in one of these roles.

If you are not currently a member of our church and would like to find out more, please let me know. There are 3 paths into active church membership: profession of faith, reaffirmation of faith, and certificate of transfer. We have no age restrictions; no one is too old to become a member, and any youth who feels ready for this commitment should talk with their parents and/or myself. I will gladly offer educational opportunities for potential and current members to become more familiar with denominational theology, polity, and more. But the primary profession of faith is this: *to proclaim Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior.* On behalf of Session, who are the spiritual leaders of the church, we are eager to welcome more people as active members of this family of faith, where we are *Growing in Faith and Sharing God's Love.*

Sunday LIFT: Living in Faith Together

Would you like to get caught up in the excitement of someone discovering *The Word* for the first time? Perhaps encouragement from someone who has *walked with God* for a while is what you are seeking? Is a Sunday morning *treat* with a friend just what you need? Then *Sunday LIFT* is for you!

Beginning in September, the Faith Formation Committee (formerly Christian Education) will be offering a new experience on Sunday mornings. *Sunday LIFT* (Living in Faith Together) is an inter-generational resource developed by GenOn ministries. This inter-generational experience is open to God's children of every age. There is no minimum or maximum age requirement to participate. We will be gathering as a family in faith!

The *Sunday Lift* sessions are built around Acts 2:42 "The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers." (CEB). Following the early church's habits each *Sunday LIFT* session begins with gathering time and then moves through the four components of the first church, with all parts connected by a common theme. The components of *Sunday LIFT* are:

1. Breaking Bread Together

When we eat together it allows us to build relationship through conversation.

2. Studying God's Word Together

We read Scripture together. We also have cross generational discussion about what God's Word is saying to each of us. It is important for different generations to learn from each other when interpreting Scripture.

3. Playing Together

Play comes in many shapes and forms. We may craft, play games, learn new skills and hobbies. What is important is that we are doing this TOGETHER.

4. Praying together

We worship and praise God through prayer. Prayer comes in lots of different styles and can be done in lots of different ways.

Sunday LIFT uses stand-alone sessions, so if you can't attend every Sunday you can still have an enjoyable and engaging experience when you can join us.

Our first theme will be **Seed to Harvest** and the session themes are:

Session 1: A Seed Story

Session 2: A Pumpkin Party

Session 3: Trees

Session 4: Fruit for All

We will be meeting in the church basement from **9:00 to 10:00AM** each Sunday beginning on **September 9**.

We want to give this new Faith Formation experience a three-month trial. At that time, we will assess *Sunday LIFT* to determine if we should continue to offer these experiences. *Sunday LIFT* will replace our traditional children and youth Sunday School classes for this three-month trial, but remember *Sunday LIFT* is for everyone! We will continue to offer our traditional Adult Sunday School class for those who are seeking to form their faith through discussions with their peers. Please read more about that class in another part of the newsletter.

We are very excited about *Sunday LIFT* and we hope you will join us! After all, who doesn't need a *LIFT* now and then!

Adult Sunday School Class

If you are looking for lively conversations about faith and theology from both historic and current day perspectives you should check out the Adult Sunday School Class! This group meets from **9:00 to 10:00 AM** in the main classroom of the education wing. Beginning **September 9**, we will be starting a video curriculum called "*First Light, Jesus and the Kingdom of God*".

This series delves into the person and ministry of Jesus, placing him in the context of a Jew in a Jewish community under the Roman Empire's occupation through the stages of his ministry, through the resurrection narrative, the history of the Christian movement, to placing it all in relation to our modern world. It features John Dominic Crosson and Marcus Borg, two of the world's leading Jesus scholars.

A few of the questions that will be explored with these guides on location throughout Galilee and Jerusalem are:

Why did Jesus happen when he happened?
Why the confluence of the Baptism movement of John and the Kingdom movement of Jesus?
Why the tiny villages around the Lake?
Why the confrontations in Jerusalem?
Why then? Why there?

Why were the titles of Caesar Augustus – Divine, Son of God, God from God, Lord, Redeemer, Liberator, and Savior of the World – taken from a Roman emperor on the Palatine hill and given to a Jewish peasant on the Palestine plain?
Was it low lampoon or high treason?
Either way, the Romans were not laughing.

What were the priorities of Jesus' proclamation of the Kingdom?
How was the status quo of Roman imperial theology subverted by this obscure Galilean whose message continues to indict empire today?

The discussion of these questions is sure to be enthusiastic and thought provoking! We would love to have you join the conversation!

We could also consider a mixed group or a couples' group. If there's enough interest, we can even start another women's group!
