Pastor's Letter

With my approaching wedding, I've had to make a decision (okay, I've had to make hundreds, but here's a biggie): whether or not to change my name.

With a fiancé who would support whatever choice I made, I was able to choose without pressure from him or anyone else. Ultimately, I have decided that I will take his last name (Schilling) as my own, and I will move my maiden name to my middle name. After over thirty years, I couldn't get used to the idea of dropping Farris completely, so I decided to keep it and add on after it, which is also what my own mother did with her name upon marriage.

This change is representative of my identity as well. In marriage, I will not be erasing my former self in favor of someone new; I will bring my full self into relationship with another, and we will create a new life together, that lets us remain individuals yet enables us to enter into a partnership that will grow, change, and develop in the years to come.

Several name changes are found in the Bible as well. God turns Abram and Sarai into Abraham and Sarah, as they prepare to become the ancestors of many nations. Jacob becomes Israel, the ancestor of God's covenant people (who nevertheless struggle with God). Saul becomes Paul, as he embarks on a new journey of spreading the good news of Jesus, the one he had formerly persecuted.

As I adjust to changing my name after marriage, it is comforting to know that I will be in good company with so many ancestors in the faith: people whose new names signal new growth, opportunities, and partnerships that God had prepared for them.

I don't know whether Abraham, Sarah, Jacob, and Paul ever forgot about the change and let the former name slip out, but I'm sure that will happen to me for a while.

Adjusting to a new name provides an opportunity for us all to be gracious to one another, laughing together over how quickly or slowly we each adapt to the change. Whether you have ever experienced a name change, either by marriage or by claiming and later rejecting a nickname, know with confidence that one name or "label" belongs to each of us and can never be erased: Child of God. We're always and forever God's children, and I'm still

Our church's Little Free Pantry is making a difference in the lives of those who use it. The LFP's mission is to help people with immediate food needs. Church members (and even people from the community) keep the LFP stocked. We are grateful for your support!

When donating items to the LFP, please remember: **no glass jars or bottles,** which can break if dropped. Instead, consider donating nonperishables in cans or boxes: vegetables, canned chicken, beef, or salmon, cereal, oatmeal, pasta, canned pasta sauce, rice, noodles, granola bars, dried fruit, Tuna Helper, mac and cheese, etc. Personal care items are also appreciated: soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, baby care items, toilet paper, tissues, etc.

For safety's sake, please check the expiration dates of the items you donate. Your contributions can be placed inside the LFP or taken to the church office. Thank you for your help as we work together: neighbors helping neighbors!
