
Youth Group

Deacons' Report

- Plans for the December 18 Community Meal have been finalized. Please read about how you can participate in this event elsewhere in this newsletter!
- Arrangements are being made for the deacons to help with the church's Adopt-a-Family program for Christmas.
- During inclement winter weather, deacons can provide or arrange rides for our seniors to Sunday worship. Please call a deacon the day before, if possible. Otherwise, please call a deacon by 9:00 AM Sunday morning.

Highlights of November Session Meeting

- Approved receiving Ryan and Sarah Brauen as members by Letter of Transfer from Irvington Presbyterian Church - Indianapolis, IN. Church has received correspondence that it will be a beneficiary of Ropp/Mary Emma Triplett Trusts. Approved to participate in "Employee Dues-Share with Health and Dependent Care Flexible Savings Arrangement Plan" (an IRS Section 125 plan) and appoint Treasurer Darin Leugers as our local administrator who would be the direct contact with the claims administrator. Maumee Valley Presbytery has provided the proposed plan, as well as a claims administrator as a service to us. Approved MVP's request asking for extra mile mission contribution of \$2.00 per member to support Christian Community of Restoration and Revival (CCRR) – new church development in MVP in the 6th year and many start up grants are no longer available. Alice Niswander passed away - Pastor Dave officiated at service and the Deacons provided a meal afterwards.
- The Church's insurance Policy with Guide One was renewed for 2014.
- Approved that our share of Peacemaking Offering - approximately \$150 - will be designated to "Doctors without Borders" in their fight against Ebola. Mission Committee will match using mission funds so the final gift will be \$300.

- Wellmann Brothers will be meeting with us to discuss rock colors for the basement entry man-made materials. Wellmann felt they would be setting up scaffolding week of November 10. Continuing to work on getting remaining holes which need dirt filled. Leaking water fountain was repaired by M + R. The October water bill for watering new grass was not significantly different than other months so we will not be requesting credit from the village.
- Distributed candy to approximately 100 kids on Trick or Treat night. Fall wreaths have been hung on exterior doors - Christmas wreaths will be hung before November 29 for Blaze of Lights. Hanging of the Greens will be Sunday, November 30 following worship service. Checking into options - mission or prison ministry - for donating unused Bibles, Hymnals, and Praise books. Approved installing a PowerPoint multimedia system in the sanctuary on a one-year trial basis at no cost to the church - include present wall projection (approximately 90 inches) and two additional 60-inch screens for rear wall and organ side - would use current projector but with more secure base.
- Home Communion was served. Pastor Dave is working with BAMA to develop a resource packet listing support services in three adjoining counties which could be used by all churches. Pastor Dave led another Bible Study at Maple Crest.
- Pastor's evaluation was discussed with elders discussing their completed surveys, strengths of our ministry with Pastor Dave and suggestions. Pastor Dave continues to feel blessed to be able to minister with us. Approved calling a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 14 following the worship service for the purpose of electing Elders, Deacons, and 2015 Nominating Committee.


