Advent is going to look and sound a bit different this year! Our worship will be centered around the theme of Calm and Bright. 2018 marks the 200th anniversary of the debut of "Silent Night, Holy Night." This hymn sung on Christmas Eve has become the best-loved worship moment of many Christians.

Something mystical occurs as we light our candles and sing the hope of "all is calm, all is bright" – peace and light for the world. This season, we will celebrate the carol's message throughout the entire season of Advent and highlight its call for our lives that can guide us all year long.

In the music and liturgy each Sunday, listen for the phrase "We need a silent night," and ask yourself what it is that we need—what it is that we seek— in the season of Advent and Christmas.

The gift God gives at Christmas is available for us all. That gift calls us to follow Jesus beyond the manger, into the streets and homes of our neighbors, all the way to the suffering of the cross and the glory of the resurrection.

The noise of the world around us – consumerism, especially in this holiday season, tries to drown out the sacred. In the midst of the violence and chaos and hatred that seem to thrive, let us remind ourselves of God's powerful gift of the Christchild, born for us all on that timeless Silent Night.


Small Groups

Highlights of November' Session Meeting

- Approved electrical easement request (from Village of Bluffton) to install power box on the alley side near the rear of the church. Agreed to hold Chicken BBQ on November 24 during lighting of "Blaze of Lights" with proceeds designated for Tyler and Laura From for a newer accessible van. Approved to receive Ben Miracle as a member by Reaffirmation of Faith – plan to recognize during November 11 worship. Approved request to place Brandie Wagner and Chad Carroll on "other" list since both are now attending other churches.
- Sink faucet in basement at manse has been replaced. The replacement for the shower base did not fit, therefore area is being sealed with "flex seal".
- Custodian Tony Carmack is completing 30 years of service to the church approved giving \$50 gift to Tony.
- In October Pastor Karol made 2 home/ hospital/nursing home visits, had 5 conversations, and sent 11 sent. Congregational activities: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), Claralice Circle (weekly), led Sunday LIFT, Nursery Care Givers Annual Review, and committee meetings. Presbytery activities: Worship Planning Team and High School Retreat Planning Meeting. Community Engagement: Pastors' Appreciation Dinner at Maple Crest and Hospice Meeting at St. Rita's. Approved Pastor Karol's request for following vacation dates: December 25-31 including Sunday, December 30 and February 7-10 including Sunday, February 9.

Crossan is described as "one of the world's foremost historical Jesus scholars." The faith journey of former Bluffton football player Alex McClelland to be shared during community event

BLUFFTON, Ohio – The family of Alex McClelland will share "Reaching Out: A Young Man's Story of Faith, Courage and Commitment" on Wednesday, Dec. 5 at Bluffton University. The presentation will take place twice, from 4-5:30 p.m. and 7-8:30 p.m. in Yoder Recital Hall.

Alex was a student at Bluffton University and a member of the Beaver football team during the 2007-08 season when he experienced pain on his sacrum bone. The pain increased with time, and in April of 2008 he was diagnosed with osteosarcoma. He died from cancer in the summer of 2009.

As a child, Alex was introduced to his faith by his family; he learned Bible stories and went to Sunday school. As he grew older, he spent less time nurturing his relationship with God. However, the diagnosis set him on an inspiring and incredible faith journey.

"Alex tried to pray, but discovered that it felt empty. Without a relationship with God, prayer was simply 'words' without feeling," explained members of Alex's family. "He could not connect to the Almighty being to whom he was praying. Through encouragement, Alex's persistence to rediscover God and God's unconditional love, Alex experienced a miracle that set him on a journey that has helped to teach countless young adults to understand that God can change their life. They simply have to reach out believing that the Lord will reach back."

Former football coach for Bluffton, Greg Brooks, will also share about Alex's impact on campus and beyond. Brooks is an area representative for Fellowship of Christian Athletes in North Carolina. Alex's family says the event will help attendees "learn how their own faith journey can be transformed."
