Highlights of January Session Meeting

- Building Restoration Project following people have agreed to serve on the committee Don Brauen, Jeanette Warren, Tom Edwards, Owen Ziessler, and Tom Hursey. Session would like a general contractor to oversee all aspects of the project. If we have concerns during the project or warranty concerns afterwards then there is one point person. Presently checking into any local companies to serve as a general contractor. Update on financial aspect 8 pledges received for \$23,900 pledged. Actual money donated so far is \$11,800.
- The pew Bibles and Glory to God Hymnals have been placed in the sanctuary. M + R has taken measurements for the stoves and new ones are on order – expected to arrive in two weeks. Clerk will be sending Thank You letter acknowledging these donations.
- Approved the Covenant (three months beginning February 1) between Rev. David Good and BPC as a Bridge Pastor. COM has already approved the Covenant. Approved the three-month rental agreement for the manse with Rev. Good. Approved allowing Rev. Good to move in the week prior to the February 1 rental agreement date – expected to move January 27 or 28.
- Approved receiving Richard and Judith Evans as members pending receipt of their Letters of Transfer from Market Street Presbyterian – Lima. Richard and Judith formerly lived in Lima, but have now moved into a home part of Maple Crest.
- Approved to meet on the second Thursdays at 7:00 PM for February/March with future meeting dates to be decided. Approved electing Lori Schmidt as Clerk. Approved electing Cindy Gillen and Dave Kisor as Co-Chairs of the Nominating Committee. Approved the following composition of session statement Session for 2014 consists of three males and six females which is representative of our congregation in terms of gender and age. Nominated the following to serve as officers of the corporation President Jay McCracken, Treasurer Cindy Gillen, and Secretary Donnas Stone.

- Approved to serve Communion on these dates: first Sunday of each month, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Eve. Since many of the blue Presbyterian Hymnals were donated by members or given as memorials, approved letting these people keep these hymnals if they wish. Hymnals have been sorted and are available to be picked up from the Library area. Any remaining hymnals will be given to a mission project.
- All Elders/Deacons were ordained/installed on January 12. Necrology and Local church information forms are being submitted to MVP. We have received our 2014 Per Capita Statement from MVP - \$28.10 per member (130 members) for a total of \$3,653. Members are being asked to pay their per capita if possible. Approved the General Assembly statistical report (membership/financial data). Lori and Clair have had numerous communications (phone/email) with MVP /Rev Good over Bridge Pastor package. Clerk has sent letters to remaining Bridge Pastor candidates stating that the position has been filled. Clerk sent letter to First Presbyterian Church in Bismarck requesting reimbursement for half of January's Board of Pension dues since Pastor Matthew is starting there January 16. An introduction to the "New Beginning" process is being held on February 19 in Perrysburg. Lori Schmidt and Diane Winebar have volunteered to attend training. Still looking for another volunteer!
- Very large attendance at Christmas Eve main service and increase in Christmas Eve communion service. Picture Directory will be printed soon - hope to be distributed at the Annual Congregational Meeting. Monday Breakfast group will continue to meet at McDonald's. Pastor Matthew feels things are going well and trusts that BPC will continue to take care of Gerry who is staying in Bluffton. Pastor Matthew shared that once a pastor leaves, he is responsible to his next church. Therefore while we all can remain friends, he will be unable to provide pastoral care, funerals, and weddings. Moving company in Bluffton on Monday – everything is packed up from manse/church.

Building Restoration Project Commitments

We are making steady progress on commitments/ pledges for the much needed Building Restoration Project.

- Estimated total project cost: \$110,000
- Amount to be paid from memorial and special funds: \$30,000
- Amount to be raised from member and friend commitments/pledges: \$80,000
- Commitments/pledges made through January 26: \$36,000 (nine units)
- Remaining commitment/pledge goal: \$44,000
- Payment period for commitments begins now and runs through December 2015

Please remember that it is important for the church office to hear from each member and friend household/family. All commitments are important regardless of size, even if your commitment cannot be financial and needs to consist of moral support! 2014 Per Capita Dues

2014 per capita dues are \$28.10 per member, or a total of \$3,653 for our 130 members. If you are able, please contribute by noting "per capita" with your payment for your family or for others that may not be able to contribute. Of the \$28.10 total dues, \$7.02 supports General Assembly, \$3.25 supports the Synod of the Covenant, and \$17.83 support Maumee Valley Presbytery.
