Pastor's Letter

On Saturday morning, January 26, fourteen of our church members joined with myself and the new General Presbyter, Rev. Dr. Matt Meinke, for a retreat on "Effective Leadership." In a mere three hours, we were presented with insightful points about how to determine, clarify, and communicate the message of our organization, and we also voiced creative ideas for how we might continue to live into our mission in some new and different ways. Here are a few highlights from our time together.

Most organizations know what they do and how they do it. Only some really take the time to figure out why they do what they do. Asking the "why" of why we do everything generally and why we do any given event or program will better direct our time and energy and will be more effective in compelling others to join with us.

Most of the time, plans are made by focusing on tactics and execution. However, four prior steps to better guide those tactics and execution are: attitude, approach, goals, and strategy. These processes may take more time than just deciding what, when, and where we're going to do something (and who's going to do it!). However, if we don't take a step back to remember *why* we are holding an event, offering a program, or making a connection, the outcomes of our efforts may not align with our expectations.

So, a challenge for us as a church in this new year is to ask – like an inquisitive child – "Why?" "Why?" "Why?" Not to be annoying, but to get to the heart of the matter; to revisit again and again our purpose, our mission, our vision.

It is clear that there is great love for this church felt by those who are a part of it. So, let's imagine and practice new ways of sharing our experience with others, that they, too, may desire to belong to this welcoming family of faith.

Thank you to everyone who serves as a greeter! Here are a few things to remember for your assigned Sunday.

Before the Service:

- 1. Arrive at least 15 minutes prior to worship.
- 2. Station one greeter at entry to downstairs and one in front of sound tech.
- 3. If you see someone come in through handicap entrance, take them a bulletin.
- 4. Welcome people and hand out bulletins.
- 5. Make sure to talk to guests. Welcome them and ask their name.
- 6. If first Sunday of month, remind people to pick up their newsletter.

After the Service:

 Go back to your greeting stations and make sure you thank any guests for joining us, offer them a visitor packet (located on back cabinet behind sound tech), and welcome them to come back soon.

Highlights of January Session Meeting

- Approved 2019 Mission Pledge (MVP \$4,248 GA \$1,699 Synod \$ 219 total of \$6,166).
 Approved 2018 General Assembly Statistical Report membership/finances. Necrology report submitted to MVP Rev. Dale Dickey, Rev. Carl Wolf, and Rev. Roy Pneuman will be remembered during February's Presbytery Meeting.
- In December, Pastor Karol made 5 home/ hospital/nursing home visits, 7 conversations with church family, and sent 30 cards. Congregational activities include: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), Claralice Circle (weekly), Ignite Caroling, Young Adult Gathering, BPC Quintet, Christmas Eve service, and committee meetings. Community Engagement activities include: lunch with BAMA colleagues and BAMA meeting. We will have BAMA pulpit exchange on Sunday, February 3 – Pastor Karol will preach at First Mennonite and Rev. Wanda Stopher will preach at BPC. Decided not to have Communion that Sunday since Pastor Karol will not be here. Approved request of \$100 from Continuing Education funds for online course 1/21 - 2/15 through Pittsburgh Theological Seminary – "Parables for the Future: Scenario and Strategic Planning".
- Deacons have reorganized for 2019:

- Community Annual Chili Cook Off will be Wednesday, February 20 at the Middle School. Proceeds will go to the Bluffton Community Assistance Program.
- Year ended well financially receipts/expenses were almost even. Financial books for 2018 will be audited by accounting students from Ohio Northern University Clair and Darin will meet with them on January 22. Have a CD

- at Citizen's National Bank maturing on February 5; however, Edward Jones presently has a higher rate. Approved to designate authority to Stewardship & Finance committee to reinvest this CD when it comes due. BPC received a \$3,047 assessment from the state of Ohio Collections Bureau in late December for 2017 payroll withholding income tax, interest, penalty, and fees. The assessment was apparently triggered by BPC initiating payroll income tax withholding in 2018 and filing the annual Ohio Employer Reconciliation of Income Tax Withheld return. No tax is due for 2017 because employees paid income taxes on their own rather than through withholding by the church. Darin promptly filed a 2017 employer return reporting \$0 tax due to the Department of Taxation and Clair sent an abatement request and explanation to the Collections Bureau. The Collections Bureau indicated it may take several months to clear the situation.
- Old tables (11) have been sold (\$325.00).
 Rebate from Menard's (\$94) will be given to
 Buildings & Grounds to purchase supplies light bulbs, garbage bags, furnace filters, etc.
 Pastor Karol asked each newly elected Elder
 (Sarah, Lynda, and Clair) to briefly share their
 personal faith. Each new Elder affirmed they
 were willing to serve. Approved that having
 examined the new Elders, they be approved for
 Installation/Ordination on Sunday, January 13.
- Following reorganizational items were addressed. Elected Lori Schmidt as Clerk. Approved Darin Leugers as Treasurer for 2019. Agreed to continue meeting on the second Thursday at 7:00 PM. Elected Sarah Brauen to serve as one co-chair for Nominating Committee – will elect other one at February's meeting. Elected Lori Schmidt as Presbytery Commissioner. Approved that the Composition of 2019 Session includes three males and six females which is representative of our congregation in terms of age/gender. Approved nominating these elders to the congregation to serve as Officers of the Corporation – President – Tenna Rhonemus, Treasurer - Cindy Gillen, and Secretary -Lynda Best.

 Approved serving Communion in 2019 on the following dates – first Sunday of each month (except February), Ash Wednesday, and Maundy Thursday.

Personal care items are also appreciated: soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, baby care items, toilet paper, tissues, etc.
