Pastor's Letter

At our Epiphany celebration on January 5, we were each invited to take a Star Word (if you didn't get one, see the bulletin board for more). We are asked to ponder what significance our star word might have in our lives, and how God might be speaking to us through this simple message.

Each month this year, I would like to invite someone to reflect on the word that they drew, and how it has been impacting their lives. I'll go first...

My star word is hope. Compared to some of the bigger, more unusual words that I know were on some of the other stars, "hope" seems simple. Basic. After all, it's one of the four words we think about with the Advent candles. It's right there in the middle of faith, hope, and love. We use it casually quite often: *hope you have a good day*!

But having selected this as my word for the whole year, I am working on making hope more than just a word that is spoken with formality in worship or informality in conversation. Carrying it with me in my planner every day, I see my star word as I flip to my to-do list and daily schedule. Where do I find hope on the overwhelming days? How can I share genuine hope with others I meet with or minister to?

1 Peter 3:15, from this past Sunday's reading says: "Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you." My present challenge to myself is: do I have that level of fervent hope within me? When I feel that I do, how can I let others see it, such that they will feel compelled to "demand an accounting" from me about it?

I'm grateful that I have 11 more months to keep letting God work in me, helping me to retrieve hope daily from wherever it may be hiding.

Highlights of January Session Meeting

- Elders and Deacons were installed on January 5. Approved request by Bluffton Area Ministerial Association to hold brief prayer service on our church lawn on World Day of Prayer Friday, March 6 at noon (willing to offer sanctuary as back up in case of inclement weather).
- December Pastoral Care: 6 home/hospital/ • nursing home visits and 11 cards sent. Home Communion Visit (served 1) with Deacon Helen Hawk on January 5. Led Mennonite Memorial Home Communion Service on January 7 (served 22). Congregational activities: Faith Formation, Word in the World, Faith Formation Intern Supervision, choir, Christmas Caroling, Claralice Circle, and Christmas Eve Service. Community Engagement activities: Bluffton Chamber Breakfast, led Bible Study at Maple Crest, and Bluffton Area Ministerial Association meeting. Approved vacation request for August 10 – 23 (including Sundays, August 16 and 23). Leadership Retreat (elders, deacons, and interested members in the congregation) scheduled for Saturday, January 25, 2020 from 9:00 AM to noon. Led by Pastor Karol, Sarah Brauen, and Rev. Dr. Matt Meinke with topics: Matthew 25 Initiative, 2020 Session Objectives (elders), Caregiving Boundaries (deacons). Affirmed for Pastor Karol to meet with/prepare new members and meet with/instruct candidates for Baptism and/or their parents.
- Darin Leugers, Treasurer, resigned effective December 31, 2019. Personnel and Stewardship & Finance jointly participated in interviews to fill Treasurer's position. Approved hiring Julia Szabo as Treasurer. Clair Winebar has completed Treasurer duties during transition and is providing training to Julia. Due to the resignation of Darin Leugers and hiring of Julia Szabo as Treasurer, approved to grant Stewardship & Finance permission to remove Darin Leugers and add Julia Szabo on all financial accounts for which the Treasurer is a signatory.

- Confirmation Class starts Sunday, January 12 during Sunday School time. Expect 4-5 participants led by Pastor Karol and Tenna Rhonemus. PCUSA curriculum being used – expect to have 12 sessions. Sarah Brauen and other volunteers will lead the remaining youth during this time. "Souper Bowl of Caring", youth group project, will sell soup/sandwiches to go following worship service on February 2 (proceeds benefit Bluffton Community Assistance program).
- Approved request to participate in Grace & • Gratitude Offering (January 19-February 16). Church family asked to support the PCUSA program by making donations and committee will determine which items are supported from funds received. Donations from church family covered all requests of 2 families we supported through "Adopt a Family". In addition to these gifts, holiday stockings were created and given to our adopted families, families in Family Promise, and several families involved with Allen County Family & Children First. Donated 16 tied blankets to Family Promise to distribute to families enrolled over the holidays and in the future. Reams' display has been taken down from church yard with lights being removed in upcoming weeks. Church's Little Free Food Pantry is being used regularly with items donated by church family and community. Reminded to check regularly to make sure food appropriate for weather, no glass, non-expired food, and restock with donated food in office.
- Approved serving Communion on the following dates in 2020 first Sunday of each month, Ash Wednesday, and Maundy Thursday.
- Elected Lori Schmidt as Clerk. Agreed to continue meeting on second Thursday at 7:00 PM with no stated meeting in July. Elected Lynda Best and Tenna Rhonemus to serve as Co-chairs for Nominating Committee. Elected Lori Schmidt as Presbytery Commissioner. Approved that the Composition of 2020 Session includes one male and eight females which is not representative of our congregation in terms of age/gender.

- Session thanked Lynda Best for working to sell the old synthesizer (\$200) and old speakers (\$150). Lynda previously sold the cabinet which went with these items. These were all unused items "stored" in room behind choir loft.
- Bluffton Presbyterian Church Safety and Evacuation Policies were approved. Parts will be shared at the Annual Congregational Meeting.

Church Membership

If you are not currently a member of our congregation and would like to find out more, please speak with Pastor Karol. There are 3 paths into active church membership: profession of faith, reaffirmation of faith, and certificate of transfer. Confirmation classes to assist our youth in making their profession of faith are currently in progress. Other educational opportunities can be made available for prospective members to become more familiar with our theology, leadership structure, and more. The primary profession of faith is this: to proclaim Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. We are eager to welcome more people as active members of this family of faith, where we are Growing in Faith and Sharing God's Love.

From the newly adopted BPC Safety and Evacuation Policies:

Alert team members (Don Brauen, Ryan Brauen, Don Carroll, Mike Rhonemus, Phill Talavinia, Clair Winebar) will be trained to know the emergency evacuation procedures for emergencies—medical, fire, tornado, etc. (Don Carroll's name was inadvertently omitted when this information was shared at the congregational meeting.)

Leadership Retreat Summary January 26

- Following the congregation's affirmation of participating in Matthew 25 Initiative, session agreed that "Building Congregational Vitality" would be our focus area.
- Using information obtained from fall congregational survey (21 surveys returned), session agreed to focus on the following areas for objectives in the coming year:
 - Mission tie Matthew 25 into existing mission efforts.
 - Community Visibility create business cards with church information for church family to share with others and looking into interest of possibly creating a community children's choir.
 - Connecting with members in church family – involving youth in church life/projects beyond Faith Formation class, connecting with visitors/members and engaging them in church activities.
