# "When the dog bites, when the bee stings"

So happy New Year. And what a new year it will be, when my opening meditation is the dark side of the song "A few of my favorite things". I mean Rogers and Hammerstein had a good thing going with "raindrops on roses and whiskers on kittens. "Perhaps a bit saccharin, but when Julie Andrews sings it, it is as good as with "a teaspoon of sugar helps the medicine go down." But what I really wanted to address is: what happens when the dog bites, when the bee stings? Lately there have been enough dark days, although no dog bites, and this is not the season for bee stings. But in the middle of dark times, I just wanted to suggest what a comfort it is when I read the words of the confessions:

You are with us as we struggle with disheartening difficulties and problems. And so, throughout life we grow to maturity in love and faithfulness, through Christ. And in this faith journey we find freedom and good cheer. So, we stand forth to give witness on both good and evil days, confident that the new life is pleasing to God and helpful to others. (Confession 9.21 adj)

or when I read the words of the Christmas carol:

"In Bethlehem a Babe was born with love enough for all.
But, miracle of miracles, the Baby lives today.
In each new heart that hears love coming through the years."

God being with us – changes everything. God becoming love in our hearts - changes everything.

And the words of the worship service each week are...well they are actually what you need to know, what you need to hear. These words change everything.

One of the delights of Sunday mornings across these last years has been the moments when I read the bulletin and I get it! And my mind says, "Yes!! That's it!! That's faith. That is life that matters!"

And then my mind says, You silly! **You** wrote that, you picked that.

But another part of me says, "No, (this is the Confessions and a hymn) God wrote that, so that it could lead us to the fullness of life. New life in Christ."

Now that, God's words of life, the journey of faith – is a happy New Year.

May you find faith and faithfulness in our worship together this year. As God is with us and calls us forward to share love!

We adopted more families in the adopt-a-family program after finding out there was a need for more help. We are working on having a Chili cook off in February with other local churches to raise money for the food pantry.

# **Highlights of December's Session Meeting**

- Will be taking out the window air conditioners in the church and storing them in the garage at the manse. Phil will check with Tom Edwards/Wendell Badertscher as to progress of work at manse.
- Members of the congregation made 15 blankets which will be blessed on Sunday. These will be given to our Adopt-a-Family, Family Promise, and Bluffton Food Pantry. Lap blankets made by Min Lindsey will be given to area nursing homes. There is additional need for more families which have not been adopted by the community. Because our members have already given to support two different families, Lynda may use local mission money to adopt additional families. Organizing a Chili Cook Off on February 22 in the MS Cafetorium. Proceeds will go to the Bluffton Food Pantry. Initial letters have been sent out to churches.
- Approved giving Christmas checks to staff.
- Approved serving Communion on Christmas and New Year's services.
- Pastor Dave led 4 worship services at BPC, one service at Mennonite Home, made visitations to church family members, officiated at Richard Evan's funeral, attended two celebrations for Min Lindsey's life, serving Communion at Maple Crest, attended high school play (youth participated), helped with Blaze of Lights and hanging of the greens, and worked with COM.
- Installation and ordination of officers will be January 8. Approved holding Annual Congregational Meeting/Corporation Meeting on Sunday, January 29 following the morning worship service.




