Pastor's Letter

Memorial Day and Labor Day mark the unofficial beginning and end of “summer” – that special time of year marked by extended time in nature, vacations to other parts of the country, and an overall change of pace from our routines that revolve around the academic calendar.

Our Faith Formation (Christian Education) Committee has made available to the congregation copies of a “guide to summer self-care for families on the go” (on the table in the back of the sanctuary). This resource, published by the SALT project, provides *simple* ideas, medium sized ideas, and **bigger** ideas, depending on what best suits your unique family's needs.

Several of the suggestions look less like creating complex projects and more like making intentional choices. For example, don't just go through the motions of your tasks, whether they be work or leisure:

*“Choose something that you're going to savor today – taking a shower, riding a bike, walking, chopping wood, reading a magazine, etc.
‘Savor’ it instead of just ‘doing’ it.”*

In other words, be alive and be present in the moment; it will be much more life-giving!

May these resources be an inspiration and a catalyst for you to look for God working and moving in your life, wherever your summer takes you. I encourage you to share these ideas with your family and friends. Then, the next time we see you, let us know how God surprised you by showing up in the midst of your scheduled and unscheduled summer adventures!

Each and every day, we can remind ourselves: “This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.” Psalm 118:24

Let us indeed rejoice in the adventures that await us.

The Surprising Acts of God

Easter-Pentecost Sermon Series from the book of Acts: May 5 – June 16

Ascension of the Lord

Forty days after the Resurrection of the Lord/Easter, we remember and celebrate the Ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ into heaven. Since this date falls on a Thursday, we will celebrate Ascension on Sunday, June 2. On this occasion, the church gives thanks for Christ's sovereign rule over all the earth, as well as his priestly intercession for us at the throne of God. With the raising of Christ to a position above all worldly powers, the earthly ministry of Christ begun at the incarnation of Christmas now concludes.



Day of Pentecost

On the Day of Pentecost (June 9) we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit descending in a mighty rush of wind and flame to inspire the Church's proclamation of Christ's rising and to empower its mission and ministry to the world. It can be thought of as the “birthday of the Church.” The notion of Easter as a season of 50 days ending at Pentecost is patterned after the ancient Jewish festival of 7 weeks from the beginning of the barley harvest (on the 2nd day after the beginning of Passover) to the end of the wheat harvest at the Festival of Weeks or *Shavuot*. The Festival of Weeks later came to be called Pentecost (“50th day”) by Greek-speaking Jews. In Jewish tradition, *Shavuot* also marks the giving of the law to Moses at Sinai; this liturgical link may inform Paul's discussions of the law and the Spirit.



Trinity Sunday

On Trinity Sunday (June 16) we proclaim the mystery of our faith in the triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One-in-Three and Three-in-One. Unlike other festivals in the church's liturgical calendar, Trinity Sunday centers on a *doctrine* of the church, rather than an *event*. It celebrates the unfathomable mystery of God's being as Holy Trinity. It is a day of adoration and praise of the one, eternal, incomprehensible God. Trinity Sunday, in a sense, synthesizes all we have celebrated over the past months of highlighting God's mighty acts: Advent-Christmas-Epiphany celebrating God's taking flesh and dwelling among us in Jesus Christ; Lent and Easter celebrating Christ's death and resurrection for us; Pentecost celebrating God the Holy Spirit becoming our Sanctifier, Guide, and Teacher.

Elders in the Presbyterian Church are ordained to be spiritual leaders along with pastors. Officers have a crucial part to play in the health and welfare of their congregations. Given our system of polity, no church will ever rise above the level of its officers. Highlights of May Session Meeting

- Deacon Craig Bowman was installed/ordained on May 5.
- In April Pastor Karol participated in the following activities - Pastoral Care: 9 home/hospital/nursing home visits, 2 conversations, and 13 cards sent. Home Communion was served with Deacons Craig Bowman/Dave Van Eman on May 5 to 7 residents at Maple Crest. Sue Van Eman was pianist. Congregational activities: Word in the World discussion group, Claralice Circle, memorial service and reception for Helen Hilty, Maundy Thursday at St. John's UCC, Good Friday at BPC (BAMA), youth group, and committee meetings. Presbytery activities: lunch with Presbytery colleague, New Pastors' Group, Continuing Education - attended Faith Trust Institute Healthy Boundaries training at the request of Presbytery, and participated in leadership of CRE Committee Preaching Class. Community Engagement activities: Mennonite Home Communities Volunteer Appreciation Lunch and BAMA and other congregational representatives' meeting with Weekday Christian Education Board President Mark Yoder to discuss concerns – difficulty to secure walkers and desire for improved communication. Approved vacation request to add 2 days to previously approved time off in August: Wednesday, August 7 and Monday, August 19 so total time away would run August 7 – 19.
- Flowers were planted and mulch spread at church. Area by new church sign cannot be mowed behind; therefore area around it will be mulched. A few elders will set up a meeting with Village Administrator Jesse Blackburn to discuss improving grading of dirt along edge of new alley. If any future plans for the new alley include church property, then the church would need to receive a formal proposal from the village.
- Approved request to place Bluffton's Relay for Hope sign in church yard for two weeks prior to event.
- Sunday LIFT ends on May 19th. Community Vacation Bible School will be held July 21 - July 25 from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at St. John's United Church of Christ. Theme is *Hero Central Discovering Your Strength in God*. We are in charge of the snack area and need 3-4 volunteers each night to help prep and serve the snacks. We also need 4 volunteers each night to serve as group leaders for the various age groups as they move from place to place each night. Maumee Valley Presbytery Delegation to Triennium will have 25 people: 8 adults and 17 youth. Two of the youth are Global Partners from Mexico, sponsored by the Defiance church. Delegation represents six churches in MVP: Perrysburg, Defiance, Ottawa, Bowling Green, Maumee, and Bluffton (includes Libby and Paige McVetta). Christian Education Walkers - 11 volunteers walked a combined total of 58 classes this year. Tenna Rhonemus is stepping down as Youth Group Leader- shared with youth on May 5 and parents were informed via email letter. Tenna was thanked for her amazing and dedicated service to our youth by serving as Youth Group leader since 2003. Faith Formation will be looking for anyone interested in filling that position.
- Approved Stewardship's request to add Clair Winebar as an additional signatory on the Citizens National Bank checking account, the Chase savings account, and authorized representative on the church's Edward Jones account (two CDs and a cash account). Approved request that profit from Easter breakfast (\$42.51) be contributed to Transportation (van) Fund. 2018 financial review has been completed by ONU and final report received – Stewardship will review in June. Member contributed a \$1,254 gift to the electronic yard sign fund during April, which increased the yard sign balance to \$4,743. As a reminder, the estimated cost of an electronic yard sign is roughly \$20,000 to \$25,000. One Great Hour of Sharing – Members and friends contributed \$1,174, including \$59 from the kids' fish boxes.

Pentecost Offering

A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people and address the needs of at-risk children. Since the offering started in 1998, Presbyterians have raised more than \$14 million for ministries that benefit younger members of God's family. We believe we are called to do even more – to inspire, support, and care for young people as they build a strong foundation of faith. 60% of the offering is used to support ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency: Young Adult Volunteers, Ministries for Youth, and Children-at-Risk. 40% of the Pentecost offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The Mission Committee will determine the use of our congregation's 40% of the offering. We will receive gifts through June 30.

BPC Greeter Instructions

Thank you to everyone who serves as a greeter! Here are a few things to remember for your assigned Sunday.

Before the Service:

1. Arrive at least 15 minutes prior to worship.
2. Station one greeter at entry to downstairs and one near the sound board (also greet anyone who comes in through the ramp entrance and give them bulletins).
3. Greet people and hand out bulletins.
4. Make sure to talk to visitors. Welcome them and ask their names.
5. If first Sunday of month, remind people to pick up their newsletter.

After the Service:

1. Go back to your greeting stations and make sure you thank any visitors for joining us, offer them a visitor packet (located on back cabinet behind sound board), and welcome them to come back soon.
