Pastor's Letter

In an effort to keep everyone safe, at their May 14 meeting, Session agreed to continue offering online-only worship through the month of June. We feel holding in-person worship any sooner would be too risky for the potential spread of COVID-19. Session also opted to establish a task force (Pastor Karol, Lynda Best, Lori Schmidt, and Phill Talavinia) who will look into necessary precautions and important considerations to recommend to the session as any changes to current operations are considered. We appreciate all you are doing to stay connected to one another and to refer prayer requests and community needs to us so that our combined resources as a congregation can be effective in providing a faithful witness to our increasingly-expanding community, reaching people in and around Bluffton and beyond.

As I wrote in the May newsletter, it may be a while before we are all able to gather together. Even when we do, it will not be "business as usual" or "back to normal." Worship will not look/feel/sound exactly like we had taken for granted. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic will require us to take serious precautions for many months to come. This is not what we'd like. We want what we had before. And yet, that is simply not possible if we truly care about keeping one another safe from the novel coronavirus.

Therefore, we have the challenge (aka opportunity) to get creative with how we are a church.

Remember, the church is not "closed;" worship is not "cancelled." *The Church is still the people* (just scattered instead of gathered); worship is still entirely possible (as we lift our hearts and minds to God in prayer with requests for our families and communities, listen to the words of scripture with fresh ears, belt our praises in song, and more) – thanks to the availability of sharing videos via the internet and mailing print materials. *The church should never be equated with a building*.

While it would be wonderful to gather together in any space, we will persevere through this time of physical distancing. Let us do all that we can to maintain our spiritual connections with our siblings in Christ.

Highlights of May Session Meeting

- Approved Personnel and Stewardships' request to pay nursery attendants Shawna and Kori, for the months of April, May, and June. Approved to submit/accept CARES Act Loan/ Grant from Small Business Administration (via Citizens National Bank) for approximately Clerk participated in seven MVP leadership Zoom conference calls topic how churches/pastors dealing with pandemic. Corporation officers signed paperwork for PPP loan/grant application for Citizen's National Bank.
- Holy week online services were well received and had many viewers. Committee members have taken over asking people to video/audio record a welcome, candle lighting/water pouring, and scripture reading for online worship service. Jayne McGarrity and Sue Van Eman continue to record music, and Jayne secures singers/musicians. Committee is exploring music licenses that would cover more music copyright permissions than we have now. Researching which type of license would best serve our needs.
- Permission given to Pastor Karol to replace plastic window well coverings at manse and for Pastor Karol and Chris to seal the manse driveway themselves. Don't think mulch will be needed at manse this year just trim bushes in June. Some church flower beds have been weeded. Sink stopper fixed at manse. Bob Hursh and Lynda Best have met with painters to get estimate for painting exterior church trim. Waiting on bids and anticipate email vote so they can get us on schedule – presently have one estimate for . Tawa has been contacted again to confirm we will be getting trees sprayed. Carpet in church basement shampooed by Roger – preschool rooms will be done when tables are taken down. Area at manse where sewer line was repaired has debris and extra dirt – will be up to us to finish this area.

April Pastoral Care: 20+ phone calls and 16 cards sent. Congregational Activities: Weekly Online Worship (Coordinating, Recording, Editing, Posting) plus extra services for Maundy Thursday and Easter evening; Weekly hosting Zoom Fellowship; Zoom Youth Group (2); Zoom Confirmation Class (2); Regularly posting on Church Facebook Page and Church Facebook Group; Weekly email with announcements and prayer requests; Weekly Claralice Circle Zoom: and committee meetings via Zoom. Presbytery Activities: Weekly check-in meetings with MVP General Presbyter and pastoral leaders; New Pastors' Group, Discipleship Team (all Zoom). Community Engagement: Good Friday Cross "Walk" Video; Bluffton Community Preschool Board Meeting Zoom; BAMA Prayer Circle at the Centre for MMH; BAMA Meeting Zoom; and wrote BAMA Devotion in Bluffton News. Thanks to Dave Van Eman for burning and delivering DVDs of worship services every other week. Bluffton Community Assistance Program distributed Community Market gift cards to BAMA pastors to make available to those in need. New member recognition and baptism of those approved for membership at March's session meeting was recorded and included in May 17 worship video. Confirmation service scheduled to be recorded in advance of and included in May 31 Pentecost worship video. Thanks to Tenna Rhonemus for co-teaching the classes with Pastor Karol. Due to the present recording and editing schedule for Sunday worship videos, Pastor Karol has switched her regular Sabbath day each week to Monday. Primary work days are Tuesday - Friday; with Saturday reserved for editing; Sunday for "hosting" Zoom fellowship call and online worship service, and other zoom calls and pastoral care contacts as needed. Vacation previously approved for August 10-23 – still planning to take August 10-16, but not 17-23. Approved request to grant Continuing Education for June 15-21. Realizing that preparing/editing online worship videos is taking additional time, session asked Pastor Karol for additional ways

we could be supportive of her.

- Elders had opportunity to share thoughts about present online worship, as well future in person worship. Small group task force including Pastor Karol, Lori Schmidt, and two others will brainstorm procedures for reopening activities/worship inside the church and present the information to session. Fellowship Committee will work to create opportunities for small outside fellowship gatherings. Session agreed to continue to evaluate monthly, but agreed to not worship in person thru June.
- Verbal job review with custodian. Recognition for Administrative Assistant's Day. Betsey Angus, Tenna Rhonemus, and Pastor Karol met with youth intern Adam Shanaman (via Zoom) to give him a positive end-of-academic year review and offered to extend his internship through the summer months, maintaining virtual communications with the youth. While these months were not initially budgeted, his hours have been at the low end of the budgeted range, so we do not anticipate going over budget even with the addition of the summer months. Salary personnel were paid as usual for the month of April. Our youth intern, Adam, was paid based on his actual April hours. Salary employees are continuing to provide normal services and/or contributing to online worship. Intend to pay salary personnel on a monthly basis and our youth intern monthly based on actual hours worked. Expect payroll costs for **two** of the next three months will be funded by the PPP. Following the receipt of PPP funds, amounts spent on regular wages and church utilities over the next 60 days convert to a grant (no repayment required). Unspent funds remain as a loan and must be repaid to the bank/government. The receipt date of PPP will start our 60 days eligible spend period. Funding for the **one** month for which PPP funds are not available will come from the general fund (as usual).
- Pizza Meal (pizza, chips, cookies, water) was delivered to Lima Rescue Mission. Expect to continue doing this twice a month.

- Ads for Shannon Theatre are "on hold" contract will be extended exact amount of time based on when movie theatre reopens.
- Church's Paycheck Protection Program Ioan application was approved, and the requested funds were received on May 4. Estimate that approximately will convert to a grant with no repayment obligation and that approximately will remain as a loan requiring repayment over a two-year period. The amount that is convertible to a grant represents eligible expenses incurred over an eight-week measurement period ending June 29. Eligible expenses include wages, salaries and benefits, and church utilities. The final agreed upon procedures report (financial audit report) covering the 2019 financial books has been received from the ONU professor and student audit team. There were no errors found in the financial records. Report included best practice recommendations for consideration -Stewardship Committee has implemented two of the recommendations. Gifts contributed for One Great Hour of Sharing were year compared to last year. Additional gifts were received during April for the Little Free Pantry, local missions, and three cents a meal. "Roll On" balance was April 30.
- Approved to receive members of the Confirmation Class (Libby McVetta, Paige McVetta, Morgan McVetta, and Avery Talavinia) by Affirmation of Faith pending meeting with subgroup of session. Diane Winebar and Sarah Brauen agreed to represent Session and meet with Confirmation Class via Zoom to review discussions during the class sessions. Approved renewing Adam Shanaman's internship contract for 2020-2021 academic year. Adam has agreed to stay in contact with the youth virtually through the summer and continue as our intern in the fall. The youth were happy to hear this as well! VBS will be held in a virtual form this year. The final format is still being discussed among the various church representatives.

Pentecost Offering

Gifts will be dedicated on Sunday, May 31 as part of worship, but donations can be made through the church office, online giving or denominational gifts anytime in June. The focus of this offering is to support Children and Youth across the world and locally.

Rev. Dr. David Gambrell, from Highland Presbyterian Church in Louisville, Kentucky shares an important reason for the Pentecost Offering. He said, "Our kids need to know they are valued in this moment – their gifts, wisdom and experiences are important. They need to know that we take them seriously and honor them as members of Christ's body, and that we want to learn from them even as they learn from us – right here, right now."

On a denominational level, the offering supports the church-wide Educate a Child, Transform the World national initiative, helps with expenses for the Presbyterian Youth Triennium, as well as tutoring and mentoring programs.

The Pentecost Offering is a shared offering, so we can designate 40% of the gifts to a local program. The Mission Committee has chosen to support Lima's Samaritan House Shelter for women and children this year. Lima's Samaritan House is a thirty-eight room emergency shelter. Since 1987, the program has been providing food, shelter, and essential services to over 250 unduplicated homeless, and/or abused women and their children per year. Women and children are referred to Lima's Samaritan House by self-referral, churches, and other public and private social service agencies.

Lima's Samaritan House can accommodate up to seventeen households at a time and up to thirty-eight individuals depending on the size of the households being served. Due to the COVID19 pandemic, donations to Samaritan House have been lower than anticipated, so our support will help a lot. 

A PLACE OF HOPE FOR CHILDREN, TEENS AND ADULTS

Coronavirus...Focus on what you CAN do!

- Wash hands more frequently
- Keep hands away from face, eyes, nose, and mouth
- Maintain clean home and car
- Open windows, get outside and get fresh air
- Do not smoke
- Minimize alcohol intake

• Build Immune System:

- Get enough healthy sleep: 8 hours/night is best! (Tip: No caffeine intake after 2:00 or 3:00 PM and no screens 1 hour before bed will greatly improve your sleep!)
- Move your body daily! Get at least 20 minutes of exercise per day.
- Eat diet high in veggies, fruits, whole grains, proteins (nuts, plain yogurt, poultry, fish).
- Decrease sugar intake.
- Increase water intake. (Suggested amount: 8, 8-oz. glasses per day)
- Take multi-vitamin.

• Decrease Anxiety:

- Limit or take a break from all media reporting on Coronavirus.
- Share something encouraging or uplifting on social media.
- Stay intentionally connected with friends and family (if not in person, via phone calls, Facetime, etc.).
- Practice deep-breathing techniques:
 Breathe in 4 counts, hold 4-6 counts,
 exhale slowly 6-8 counts; repeat 5 times in a row multiple times per day.
- (Check out these apps-Abide, Calm, Centering Prayer, Reflect)

- Do something you enjoy like reading, puzzles, knitting, drawing, biking, running, watch a great movie, etc.
- Laugh often!
- Be intentional about gratefulness: Make a list of 3 things you are grateful for each day.
- Try yoga at home. (Check out holyyoga.net)
- Do something for someone else: send an encouraging note, email, text, share supplies with someone in need, etc.
- Listen to Christian music stations geared toward hope. (Try WBCL or Pandora for your favorite artists!)
- Pray for the health of our nation, government and medical officials, schools and students, job concerns, those working to contain the virus, and for God to bring good out of this in yourself and in our nation.
- Spend time reading God's Word and journaling. (Tip: Try looking up all verses that have to do with peace and journal about them. Check out You Version Bible app for other guided plans.)

Church Music and Covid-19

A Response from the Presbyterian Association of Musicians May 21, 2020—Ascension of the Lord



We weep with the psalmists.

Like those who made their lamentation by the waters of Babylon, our harps are hanging on the willows. Our tongues have been silenced. How can we sing the Lord's song ... in a time of exile, illness, and isolation? ... when singing has become a dangerous activity? ... when choir rehearsals are "super-spreader events"? ... when the breath of life disperses disease and death? As people who have devoted our lives to leading the people of God as they lift their voices in song, we are heartbroken. At the same time, we respect the wisdom of experts who have warned of the high risks associated with public singing during the Covid-19 pandemic. We believe that current measures to restrict singing—as much as we might lament them—are in the best interest of the church and world at this time. We weep with the psalmists. But we also pray with the prophets.

Remembering Jeremiah's counsel, we will build houses and plant gardens, even now. We will continue to learn new music, educate young musicians, train our hands and minds and voices, select hymns and anthems for worship, imagine special programs, conceive of choir tours, and listen for the Spirit leading us into songs as yet unknown. We will trust that the Lord has good plans in store for us, plans for our well-being, to give us a future with hope. Remembering Isaiah's promise, we will listen with longing for the distant music that will herald the homecoming of God's people, when flowers begin to bloom in the desert and the ransomed will return with joyous song. We will be praying, preparing, practicing for that great day. (See "Making Music in the Meantime" below.)

We weep with the psalmists.
We pray with the prophets.
And we sing with the whole creation.

We know that the praise of God can never be silenced. The ancient and eternal song of God's saving love will never end. The rivers and oceans sing "hallelujah!" The stones along the road shout "hosanna!" The trees of the fields clap their hands. The mountains and hills skip with joy. We will keep tuning our hearts to that cosmic symphony, joining our voices with a great cloud of witnesses, the people of God in every time and place, forever singing: Holy, holy, holy! Until our final breath, we will proclaim the final words of the final psalm, "Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!" As we seek to sing the Lord's song in these challenging times, the psalm prayer for Psalm 150 expresses our fervent faith, steadfast hope, and abiding joy:

Great and glorious God, unite our praise with the praise of all creation: singing your mighty acts with every breath, playing music to your name with all our instruments, joining the dance of stars and planets with our whole bodies; for you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High—Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. **Amen.** —Book of Common Worship (WJKP, 2018), 1077.
