Pastor's Letter

In mid-April, I took the opportunity to attend a continuing education event called Trent at Montreat (Montreat is a Presbyterian Conference Center near Asheville, NC). This small-group, select-a-track conference is open to ministers and other church leaders, with a special emphasis on those who are new in ministry.

The track I chose to participate in focused on the unique blessings and challenges of ministry as a solo pastor. We had 7 ministers from throughout the Eastern US in this track led by Rev. Dr. Felipe N. Martinez, a PC(USA) minister who has served as a solo pastor and a presbytery executive in both Indiana and Illinois. Our conversations focused on such themes as abundance, identity, strengths, partnership, self-care, and sharing stories.

In addition to participating in one of the track options, we gathered together daily for worship and short talks called "mini-notes" offered by the various conference leaders. The conference musicians were talented pianists and leaders of congregational singing: Eric Wall and Tony McNeill, the latter of whom presented a beautiful new setting of the Lord's Prayer, which I hope we will sing together sometime.

I feel my time at this conference provided me with some good questions and ideas – tools to add to my ministry "toolkit" as we continue to partner together, pastor and members, of Bluffton Presbyterian Church. I also look forward to continuing to connect with you beyond Sunday worship, whether through a shared meal or a local community event. Please let me know how I can better serve you as your pastor, both in worship and in daily life.

Highlights of April Session Meeting

- Approved calling a Congregational Meeting on April 29 for the purpose of discussing ownership of alley, proposed alley improvements, and voting to approve a quitclaim deed which would give the alley to the village. Approved that if congregation approves quitclaim deed for the alley, Bluffton Presbyterian Church will contribute \$5,000 towards the alley community project. Lori will work with Presbytery Stated Clerk to present information to them for approval.
- Session Minute Books and Membership Roll Book were reviewed by MVP in March and found to have no exceptions. Received letter from Branch of Congregational Life (MVP) concerning Toledo Urban Task Force mission partnership between Grace Presbyterian, Collingwood Presbyterian, and Grace Community Center. Asking for funds to call pastor for minimum of three years with 60% of time towards mission outreach and 40% of time as Grace's minister. Approved giving \$600 per year for three years with money to come from Bixel-Magee money designated for mission.
- Part was needed to fix furnace for heat in church basement. Approved having Mid-Am Facilities clean fans/speaker boxes in sanctuary for \$250. Approved to have Mike/Patrick Rhonemus continue to mow the yard at the manse.
- Approved License Release form (all ages) requesting permission to post pictures on media sites – will be added to Manual of Operations.
- Planning stages of having a summer community outreach picnic/games on Sunday, July 15 from 4:30 to 6:30 PM on the church lawn. Pop can money has been designated for Shannon Theatre movie passes for those receiving assistance from the Bluffton Food Pantry.

- Approved personnel committee of Betsey Angus, Jodi Brauen, and Tom Edwards. Gift card has been purchased for Cathy for Administrative Assistant's Day.
- During the past month Pastor Karol made 9 home/hospital/nursing home visits, 3 home Communion visits with Deacons Dave Van Eman and Marilyn Edwards, and 7 conversations with church family members. Congregation activities: committee meetings, small group circles, Maundy Thursday, and Word in the World. Presbytery activities: attended two New Pastor's Group meetings. Community activities: Chamber breakfast, Findlay FABSS visit, community meal, Weekday Christian Education walker, BAMA Good Friday Procession and worship, BAMA meeting, preached at chapel service at Bluffton University, met with local pastor, and wrote Bluffton News devotional. Emergency pastoral coverage has been arranged for when she is on Continuing Education April 16 - 22. Noted that registration for this event may increase from \$322 to \$455 depending on housing.
- Bluffton Preschool is very interested in joining with us on Craft Show Day – proceeds will be split. Approved that our share of proceeds will go towards general operating fund.
- Approved request from Lion's to have a Bounce House on church grounds during Wheels Festival on June 15 – need to provide proof of insurance and volunteers to supervise. Approved request from Bluffton Preschool to use sanctuary on May 16 and 17 for their Graduation. Approved that we would sponsor up to 30 (at \$15 per person) for Ignite's Mothers' Day Tea at By Still Waters and that congregation could be asked for donations.



Put a prayer request in – take a prayer request out. Look for prayer request slips in the pews and near the prayer box. Or use your own paper. Requests can be as simple as "I'm having back pain," or "My son is looking for a job." The slips can be placed in the box or in

the offering plates. Prayer requests can be submitted anonymously. Allow someone in your church family to support you in private prayer.
