#### **Pastor's Letter**

I would like to take the opportunity to share with you a letter from the Bluffton Area Ministerial Association, a group in which I am glad to count myself a member. After discussing this topic, we felt strongly that we wished to use our voice to support this non-partisan issue on the upcoming May 7 ballot for residents of Allen County:

In Scripture we hear of a time when Jesus was asked, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" The response was, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind; and love your neighbor as yourself." While the one asking the question understood loving God, there was a follow-up question, "And who is my neighbor?"

Christians of all times and generations have been left with this very same question throughout history. We are in a constant state of asking that question with regards to who our heart, soul, strength, and mind should love as ourselves. Is it the literal neighbor who resides in the home next to mine? Is it the neighbor who sits next to me in the pew at church? Is it the neighbor who lives across town? Is it the refugee, the homeless, the destitute, the downtrodden, the oppressed, the enslaved, or the stranger? Who is my neighbor?

The answer, of course, is yes to all those listed and more. As Christians we are called to care for all of our neighbors, no matter the form they take or the function they fulfill in our lives. Yet on rare occasions, the response to the question of, "Who is my neighbor?" is given a very clear and concise definition. Such is the case with the recent Allen County Regional Transit Authority's (ACRTA) request for financial support from all of its neighbors.

In 2018 there were 1,303 trips made to Bluffton for elderly members of our community and persons with disabilities in order to transport our neighbors to their appointments, treatments, and to provide a quality of life which all members of Allen County may enjoy. This service, which relies on recently reduced state and federal funding in order to function, is seeking a small sales tax increase on the May 7 ballot that will not affect the cost of utilities, rent or groceries, in order to continue serving our neighbors with the critical and essential service of transportation.

Our neighbors, the elderly and disabled persons who rely on this service for their quality of life, are in need of our love and support in order for such services to continue. Families who rely on this service in order to work, to pay their bills, and to care for their loved ones—our neighbors—are in need of our love and support. So it is with this humble yet great love and support that the pastoral leaders of the Bluffton Area Ministerial Association (BAMA) would like to express their endorsement of the ACRTA's sales tax levy on the May 7 ballot.

We would encourage any and all people of faith to seriously consider offering their own love and support to this issue, as it is a way in which we might express our love to our neighbors; providing for them as God has provided for us. Were we to ask the question, "And who is my neighbor?" would we not be told to look to those in our community who rely on such public services for their quality of life? Let us love and support our neighbors as we have been called to do and support the ACRTA on May 7.

### **Highlights of April Session Meeting**

- Approved that having examined the new Deacon Craig Bowman and he affirmed he was willing to complete the unexpired three year term, he be approved for Installation/ Ordination on Sunday, May 5.
- Approved request from Lions to use church lawn for Bounce House on Friday, June 14 Wheels Festival.
- In March, Pastor Karol provided Pastoral Care: 5 home/hospital/nursing home visits and 19 cards sent. Home Communion served to 2 residents at Mennonite Memorial Home with Elder Tom Edwards. Congregational Activities: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), Claralice Circle (weekly), Healthy Pastors, Healthy Congregations Seminar, Lenten meal at Emmanuel UCC (three times), committee meetings, and graveside service for Helen Hilty - Memorial service and reception will be on April 12. Presbytery activities: New Pastors Covenant Group and CRE Committee Meeting. Community Engagement activities: Conversation gathering with Bluffton University President Dr. Jane Wood, Weekday Christian Ed walker(twice), BAMA Church Security Meeting with Police Chief Ryan Burkholder (Lori also attended), and BAMA Meeting. Approved requested vacation dates June 28 – July 1, including Sunday, June 30. Church Security Information: meeting summary - Police Chief Ryan Burkholder is willing to meet with each church to evaluate strengths/weaknesses in church's present plan. Main areas of focus: personal safety, property security, financial security, cyber security.
- Approved Mission Committee's request to ask for monetary donations (via bulletin board) to support Bluffton's Relay for Hope June 21.
- Gift card given to Cathy Carroll for Administrative Assistant's Day.
- Session approved asking for minimum of \$100 donation for old speakers/amp/cabinet.

Pine cones have been cleaned from church vard. Flowers will be planted and mulch spread at church. Handicap entrance has been repainted and noted that it was damp - will contact Wellmann about problem. Church has lost some shingles this winter, will need to be investigated. Approved to have First Klass Lawn Care provide lawn treatments at church and manse for 2019 for approximately \$700. Because of safety concerns for members changing bulbs in hanging lights in sanctuary, session agreed to hire Green Options to inspect hanging lights in sanctuary, make any needed repairs, and replace all bulbs will LED lights. Approved Green Options estimate of \$1,440.16.

#### Thank You, Edythe Cupp - Estate Planning and Bequests

Longtime members may remember Edythe Cupp. Edythe graduated from Columbus Grove High School, attended Bowling Green Normal College (precursor to BGSU!), Ohio Northern University, and graduated from Ohio State University. Edythe's profession was teaching home economics with assignments at an academy in Utah and local high schools including Wapakoneta, Lima, and Bluffton. Edythe was a member of Bluffton Presbyterian Church (BPC) from 1964 until her death in 2004 at the age of 100.

One way that Edythe expressed her appreciation of BPC membership was by establishing an investment income endowment fund administered by the Presbyterian Foundation. Edythe's endowment has and will continue to benefit our church in perpetuity. The endowment assets generate annual investment income of approximately \$500 which is paid by the Presbyterian Foundation to BPC, thereby contributing to the collective efforts that ensure our successful, ongoing work. Edythe's gift is an example of faith and trust and is a testament to BPC's mission of Growing in Faith, Sharing God's Love.

As the Stewardship and Finance Committee has explained in periodic newsletter articles regarding estate planning, our primary goal is that you conduct at least basic estate planning for your and your family's sake. We also encourage you to remember the church in your estate plans as an expression of the importance of faith and church in your life and as an opportunity to ensure BPC's health for future generations. One important topic we should all consider is end of life issues. One aspect of this is thinking about our future healthcare options. National Healthcare Decision Day (which occurred on April 16) is a day to help individuals learn more about Advance Directives and to have opportunities to complete the documents. It's not only important to have the documents, but it is more important to have the conversations about what your health care wishes are, if in the event you are unable to speak for vourself, the person you appoint knows how you want to be cared for and decisions are made that reflect your wishes. Please join St. Rita's Hospice staff in conjunction with local churches for an informational meeting held at the Bluffton Town Hall on Thursday evening, May 9, from 6:00 to 7:30 PM.

## ACRTA May 7 Tax Levy – What, How, and Why



On May 7, Allen County voters will consider a very small sales tax levy to support the services of the Allen County Regional Transit Authority. ACRTA is a critical service to all communities in Allen County. While most people think of the big buses that run fixed routes in Lima and surrounding townships, they may not realize that ACRTA's Uplift vans travel throughout Allen County providing service to elderly residents and persons with disabilities. In 2018, ACRTA provided 46,671 trips for these individuals. 1,303 of these trips were to Bluffton.

When the last ACRTA levy failed in 2017, transit services were cut, which hurt a lot of people and businesses. ACRTA operates mostly on state and federal grants, which have been substantially reduced. This small sales tax increase (0.1%) would give them consistent, dedicated local funding to match and leverage state and federal funding. For consumers, this will mean paying an extra 2 cents on a \$20 purchase.

The levy funds will allow RTA to maintain current services, as well as bring back evening hours which are necessary for second and third shift workers, weekend service, and three routes that were cut in 2018.
