Pastor's Letter:

When we think of November, we think of Thanksgiving, which makes us think of stuffing a turkey, stuffing ourselves, and watching football, all on the eve of the biggest shopping day of the year. But what can we do to get to the heart of the word, to spend this season truly giving thanks for the blessings of our lives?

We can express gratitude to those with whom we spend our time, at work, at home, at appointments, at stores. Every interaction is an opportunity for sharing the light of Christ in you with someone else. It could be through a simple smile, a heart-felt thank you, or a sincere expression of concern for the person's well-being. We know that receiving these small gestures can put us in a better mood, so why not do the same for others? It is completely within our power to do so. Further, we can express gratitude to God for being with us in the present season of our lives, no matter what that looks like for each of us. In giving ourselves to God in worship, prayer, and daily living, we are reminded what a blessing it is to enjoy the life we have been given.

Yet life is hard; this we all know too well. So we find our passions, the places "where our deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet" (Frederick Buechner). While I know that God has called me to be in ministry with you in this time and place, I am just beginning to explore some more specific ways to be engaged with the needs facing the Church and the world. To that end, I attended three local workshops in the past month on the topics of the opioid/heroin crisis, perinatal loss, and Stephen Ministries.

The opioid crisis is now officially a national public health emergency, though this has been known for a while in communities around the country, including here in Ohio. The path to this epidemic of addiction involved aggressive pharmaceutical companies and over-prescription of painkillers, which then run out and lead people to purchase cheap heroin (chemically very similar to prescription opioids) to continue achieving adequate endorphin levels. Overdoses are all too common, and relapses in treatment are frequent, but several local resources exist, especially through at MercyHealth St. Rita's Hospital in Lima. The 24-hour number for the regional crisis center is 1-800-567-4673. Help is available at any stage of addiction.



A one-day conference on perinatal loss at Blanchard Valley Hospital in Findlay was powerful and informative. The loss of a child experienced before a full-term pregnancy, at the time of birth, or in infancy is hard to imagine. No words can ease the pain of losing an infant. However, it is crucial to support the parents throughout such a difficult journey with love, prayer, and presence. As a community of faith, we can provide a place for those experiencing such loss to voice their pain and to work through the long process of healing. We can provide rituals around such loss that our culture does not offer, and we can work to lift the silence that buries the struggles of perinatal loss and of infertility, which affects 1 in 8 couples in this country.

Stephen Ministers are members of a congregation trained to provide one-to-one Christ-centered care to hurting people. These are people with a compassionate heart who've been equipped with the skills to listen, encourage, and offer support when someone is in need. Some of this type of outreach is given through our deacons' care ministry. In some circumstances, more concentrated care could be beneficial through a dedicated volunteer such as a Stephen Minister to meet regularly with a person experiencing significant need. I am glad to find out that we already use the *Journeying through Grief* series to share with those who lose a loved one. If there is interest in exploring more resources, I might suggest a study of the book *Christian Caregiving: A Way of Life*. I also have a copy of a new resource called *Cancer: Now What?* Both of these books are available for you to borrow.

People within and connected to our congregation and our local communities are in need, whether it is visible or not. How can we reach out and show support? Are we willing to ask for help when we need it? These are important questions to ask ourselves and one another in this season of giving thanks and counting our blessings. May we help others have more reasons to be thankful.

Please pause for a few moments from your hectic schedule to consider just 10 of the many ways the world is a better place because of you:

1. Music from the choir, praise team, youth choir and other talented individuals is heard every Sunday of the year.
2. People in need can avail themselves of food from our own Little Free Pantry and from the Bluffton Food Pantry.
3. Families are able to eat together and get a restful night's sleep together and ultimately have a chance to break out of the cycle of poverty (Family Promise).
4. 130 mission co-workers in 70 countries are sharing the Good News, seeking reconciliation in cultures of violence and addressing the root causes of poverty (PCUSA World Mission).
5. Eighty 3-and 4-year old preschoolers have a safe, convenient and comfortable place to prepare for life (Bluffton Community Pre-school).
6. Inspiring sermons that connect the Word with our lives are heard from the pulpit every week of the year.
7. Those who are homebound receive visits, cards, and prayers from your Deacons, Pastor, and other members of the congregation.
8. Visual images of liturgy, music, and inspirational pictures are offered each week to enhance the congregation's engagement in shared worship.
9. Local families are able to celebrate Christmas with food, warm clothes, and toys for their children (Adopt a Family).
10. School children are escorted safely across the street to the Mennonite Church so they can hear the Good News of Jesus Christ (Weekday Christian Education).

Highlights of October's Session Meeting

- Ryan Brauen has met with three companies to review sanctuary projection project. Also talking with Emmanuel UCC and Ottawa Presbyterian who have recently done this project. Size of screens/TVs will impact price of project and equipment. While no final decisions were made, Session is interested in completing this project.
- Ryan Brauen also presented information on a digital yard sign options – since some members had expressed an interest. All options were extremely expensive (approximately \$25,000 with a lifetime expectancy of 10 years). Would need to think how this would be utilized, not moving forward with this project at this time.

- Maumee Valley Presbytery met on September 19 in Monroe, Michigan. Cindy Gillen, Diane Winebar, and Lori Schmidt attended to welcome Pastor Karol, as well as to recognize Pastor Dave Good's retirement. Other new pastors recognized- Ben Shaw – Ottawa, Elaina Sipes – Toledo Christ, CRE Julie Fogle – McComb, Elder Rose Jones – Clyde, and Rev. Julie Kling – Fremont First – as well as Rev. Mark Rich – Lima Market Street leaving going to mission field. Susan Meier, Presbyter for Common Life, will be retiring in February. Approved forming search committee to search for a Temporary Presbyter for Common Life which could become an installed position after three years. MVP in process of restructuring since fewer full time MVP staff and pastors available to serve on various committees. Per Capita for 2018 will be \$30.75 (\$20.00 MVP, \$3.25 Synod, and \$7.50 GA). First Presbyterian Church of Hicksville was dissolved. Guide One, insurance company for many churches in presbytery, has been slow to respond to Adrian's church roof collapse from early June. Shared success of our "Little Free Food Pantry" during "Good Minutes".



- Open House at Manse, to see completed renovations, was well attended – approximately 50 people – PNC provided light refreshments. Working to secure sump pump cover in manse basement. Blinds have been installed in Pastor's Office. M+R determined water fountain was plugged with accumulated coffee grounds. Light switch in manse basement needs repaired. Freezer in garage at manse does not work – will be hauled to recycle. Presently no outdoor electrical outlets at manse and only one in garage – will seek to remedy this.

- Approved electronically to transfer \$100,000 from Chase (Building Fund) to CDs at Citizens National Bank. Approved electronically for BPC to adopt a Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan (HRAP) for Pastor Karol with Dick McGarrity as the Plan Administrator. Membership Rolls were reviewed. Tenna Rhonemus attended the workshop on serving Communion in September. Approved that Tenna Rhonemus, having completed the class, be allowed to serve Communion in our church. Clerk will submit this information to Committee on Ministry for their approval. Lori agreed to serve on subcommittee for MVP to review MVP's Professional Misconduct Policy.
- Four volunteers are providing transportation to Sunday Service for church member who requested service.
- Church Mutual will continue to be our insurance carrier for 2018. November 12 will be Stewardship Sunday – will have Minutes for Mission prior. Per Capita for 2018 is \$30.75 (Membership Dec. 2016 – 117 members). Approved request to invest an additional \$100,000 in CDs at rate of \$10,000 per month over the next 10 months. Depending on interest in local banks, it is possible money will be invested outside of Bluffton.
- Approved designating our share of Peacemaking Offering to Family Promise. Served meal for Family Promise at both Emmanuel UCC and St. Mary's – noted that Emmanuel UCC has decided not to continue as host church. Ignite will be assembling/packing 8 buckets for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (goal was 5). Working on getting transportation to Elkhart, Indiana. Fleece blanket project for November. Annual community Chili Cook Off will be Tuesday, February 20 from 5:30 to 7:00 PM at Bluffton Middle School. Proceeds will go Bluffton Community Assistance program.
- Pastor Karol was presented gift from congregation in honor of Clergy Appreciation month

- Installation set for Sunday, November 5 at 4:00 PM – PNC will coordinate reception. Approved to serve Communion at Installation – Pastor Karol will coordinate with Deacons/Worship. New Spectrum internet modem installed at church, may need additional work to get good Wi-Fi in sanctuary. Approved vacation request– December 25-January 2 (Sunday, December 31). Approved that second week of unused vacation for 2017 be rolled over to 2018. Computer and office chair purchased. Will try to sell old chair on Bluffton Online Garage Sale. Pastor Karol attended following : Pastoral care visits (August – 4, September – 9), committee meetings, small group meetings, MVP meeting, MVP New Pastors' Gathering, MVP Child Protection Seminar, BAMA, met with local pastors, interview with Diane with Findlay Courier about Little Free Food Pantry, Bluffton University student worship service, and installed Elder Betsey Angus.
- Approved request from Village of Bluffton to host Reams' Display – set up days Saturdays, November 11 and 18. Village will need to provide proof of insurance. Still in process of recruiting volunteers to help.

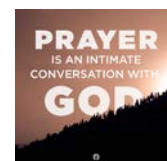
