#### Pastor's Letter

At the end of September, I attended a conference called Stewardship Kaleidoscope. One of my most important gleanings from this conference was something rather basic: saying thank you.

Saying thank you is something we teach young children so that they are polite and learn their manners when interacting with others. We teach it as an obligation in response to a gift, with the hopes that the feeling of thankfulness will eventually accompany the expression. As adults, do we sometimes find ourselves in the habit of thanking from obligation, without allowing ourselves to experience the full joy of the feeling of gratitude?

In any long-term relationship, saying thank you can become a rote habit or can fall away completely. That's unfortunate. Feeling real gratitude for what someone else has done can help maintain a strong connection in the relationship. This is true in personal relationships, and it is also true in communal relationships, such as the faith community of the local church.

Many people remain active in the same faith community for a significant portion of their life. What a gift of faithfulness and commitment! It is quite possible that as pastors and church leaders come and go, those members who faithfully serve and give, often in quiet, behind-the-scenes ways, are acknowledged less and less. Hopefully, giving and serving are internally motivated. Nevertheless, it is vital to making all participants feel valued to express thanks in both general and specific ways. All gifts deserve to be acknowledged, and most everyone likes to feel appreciated!

So, as we enter the month of November, when Americans celebrate Thanksgiving, let us be thankful for anyone and everyone who contributes to Bluffton Presbyterian Church in any way: time, talents, and treasures. There is no limit to the methods and number of times in which our thanks can be expressed. In acknowledging the gratitude we feel for one another, let's not forget the first part we learned when we were young: find a way to say thank you!

#### **Highlights of October's Session Meeting**

- Electronically approved request for Fultz Sign Company to create and install three church signs (front 4x6 with two posts, white office sign, and sign for rear of building) at the cost of \$2,685 with money to be taken from Triplett Presbyterian Foundation money with remaining amount from 2017 Richard Evans' Bequest (9-0). Electronically agreed to keep front bushes (9-0). Approved to remove Katie McCracken from "other" list since she joined the Roman Catholic Church in September. Review of Membership roll completed by Pastor and Clerk. Received official letter from MVP sharing that the Urban Toledo Project was unable to secure enough funds and therefore project is not moving ahead – releasing us from our three-year commitment.
- There are small cracks in floor of basement bathroom shower – various options discussed. Approved to purchase "Shower Floor Repair Inlay" for approximately \$100 to be installed by Kim Best. New faucet has been purchased to replace leaky sink faucet in the manse basement. Crack in paint in upstairs bedroom closet – to be repainted. Owen Ziessler working on putting an electrical outlet on the outside of the garage. Church had a small water leak in basement overnight on October 6; water is gone; likely cause is outside drain blocked by leaves. Drain grate has been cleared of leaves. Batteries were changed in all detectors. House of Hindenach said cleaning speaker grills would be very difficult since they are secured in the attic. Old paint cans and broken chairs were removed from furnace room area. Light bulb changed in motion detector light. Brush in pine trees by parking lot was removed. Lynda Best trimmed bushes at church.
- Alley Stamped concrete has been laid and sealed. Alley is now open and handicap entrance is accessible. Ryan was meeting with group concerning "plantings". Church signs – have been installed.
- Pastor Karol was given a Panera Gift Card for Pastor Appreciation Month.

- During the last month Pastor Karol participated in the following – Pastoral Care Activities: 5 home/hospital/nursing home visits, 5 conversations, 8 cards sent. Home communion: 2 visits with Deacon Helen Hawk. Congregational activities: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), Claralice Circle, Sister Min Circle, Community Picnic, led Sunday LIFT, Blessing of the Animals Service, Pastor Relations Committee, and committee meetings. Presbytery activities: Presbytery Meeting FPC Huron, New Pastors' Gathering (twice). Community Engagement: met with another pastor and BAMA Meeting. Shared highlights from Continuing Education Stewardship Kaleidoscope Conference. Approved granting Continuing Education for Pastor Karol to attend CREDO: October 15-21, 2019 and October 12-19, 2020 at cost of \$500 per year. Event is sponsored by Board of Pensions and requires a two-year commitment.
- Presbytery met on September 16 in Huron very warm non-air-conditioned church! Pastor Karol elected to serve on the Commissioned Ruling Elders Committee. Approved raising Presbytery's Per Capita portion \$1 for 2019 (noted that money from Per Capita does not cover expenses – using bequest money to make up difference). Approved that the Reverend Doctor Matthew David Meinke be employed for the position of General Presbyter for MVP beginning November 1 – approved terms. Youth Triennium to be held at Purdue University in July – promoting to send group from our presbytery. Welcomed – Rev. Ann Wasson (Defiance), Rev. Thomas James (Toledo Eastminster) and Rev. James Hodsden (Norwalk). Rev. Lynn Bova, Interim Presbyter for Common Life through October 31, was recognized for her work in the presbytery for many years. She will be serving as Interim Pastor for church in Miami Valley Presbytery. Rev. Roy Pneuman was remembered for his most recent service with Committee on Ministry. Time spent discussing/sharing ideas for Presbytery reorganization – based on three geographical areas with three main committees. Churches would have liaisons from these committees.

Information shared on the proposed "Electrical Easement Request" - In order to power the alley and the Blaze lights from a new electrical service and remove these loads from the churches electrical service an easement will be necessary to mount the electrical panels. Looking at an approximate 6' wide easement along the grass portion of our property between the handicap ramp and the parking lot. Village would write up the request and Jay McCracken has agreed to review. MVP has been consulted and feels Session has power to approve this request. Approval given for Village to use church yard for Reams Display – November 3 and 10 – Lynda will talk with Jessie about proof of insurance. Church's 170<sup>th</sup> Anniversary will be in 2019 – discuss possible activity next year.

#### Dear Friends,

It seems like the Stewardship/Finance Committee is in the habit of asking you for donations – at least once a year – but we rarely report back to you to let you know what has become of the money you give. So, we would like to do that now. You are probably already aware that much of the budget goes for ensuring that on Sunday we're inspired by wonderful music and provocative thoughts from Pastor Karol. But did you know that:

- This year for the first time we allocated some of our budget to marketing in other words to raising the community's awareness of our church. For example, since early this year, preview ads at the Shannon Theater include a message from us. This enables us to talk to families many of them with young children about what is going on at our church.
- Our support helped make the village alley beautification project next door possible. It isn't quite complete, but you can begin to imagine what it will look like when it's finished. The alley might be put to any number of uses. For example, it could become a Music Alley where a guitar player might plunk away during lunch time and people who usually eat a sandwich at their place of work might instead come out and listen.
- Have you seen the new signs? For a long time, we have relied on the sign at the corner to give basic information about us to the community. It has done a good job, but it doesn't reach everyone. For example, those traveling south on Main or parking their cars in the lot might miss it.
- Further, we are embodying Jesus' command to care for "the least of these" by serving the community meal at the Senior Center and participating in the Family Promise program of caring for the displaced at local churches.

Some projects have been supported by the current year's budget and some by memorial funds given earlier. We felt comfortable putting memorial funds to work since our current year's budget is in balance.

As you prayerfully consider your gratitude for all that this congregation offers to you and others, we hope you will take a few moments to discern your personal ability to support the church, and then complete your pledge card for next year. When you bring your pledge card to worship on **November 4**, please remember that a generous donation will help us to reach out sufficiently to our community again in 2019.
