Pastor's Letter

At the September 8 church officers' retreat, currently serving elders and deacons considered the topics of evangelism, hospitality, and church growth. While each of these topics could fill a day on their own, we had lively discussion and shared creative ideas on how the three goals are both separate and interrelated.

As a very small sample of what we discussed, consider the following statements from Connie Cole Jeske, as found on Ministry Matters: "What does it mean for us as Christians to love people today? If we are to love people, we must be willing to be in relationship with them. Loving people causes a constant tension, because loving a person necessarily forces me out of my comfort zone. Loving others diverts my attention to them; my focus shifts away from myself. When I actively, consciously, intentionally love others, I go beyond my own sphere into theirs. That may take me to someone's doorstep, but more likely it will take me into a neighborhood laundromat, playground, or coffee shop. And instead of reciting an outline of the gospel message, I will strike up a conversation about whatever the other person is doing or thinking or struggling with at the moment. I'll look for ways to help, to be a friend, to do the loving thing, moment by moment, in relationship. This is a definition of assertive evangelism today. Assertive evangelism and welcoming hospitality may be in tension at times, when we are deciding where to use resources and what efforts to emphasize in our congregations. But they are both ways to love others, and both are important as we answer our call to share the good news of Jesus Christ."

As we continue these sorts of conversations in our faith community, we remember that we can grow both spiritually and numerically. In reflecting on who we are and what we have to offer to those around us, I call us to return often to this prayer: Loving God, thank you for the gift of having good news to share. Give us bold witness and courage as we talk with those around us who have not experienced the fellowship with you and with one another that we have here. Help us to throw open our doors and invite your people in, through Christ our Savior, Amen.


Highlights of September's Session Meeting

- Approved request to allow Bluffton Community Preschool to hold monthly board meeting at the church on the 3rd Monday. Approved request from Tom Edwards to borrow tables/chairs for neighborhood picnic.
- Carpets/chairs/pews in sanctuary have been cleaned. Stains on hallway wall will not come off, plan to paint with Kilz and then repaint. Sanctuary fans cannot be reached with extended brush. M+R cleaned outdoor AC unit at manse, determined it probably has a leak and should be re-evaluated next spring. Leaky faucet in the manse garage was fixed.
- Approved to designate our share of the Peace and Global Witness offering for a PCUSA "Mission Co-Worker" - to be selected by the Mission Committee.
- Approved request by Pastor Karol to have Sunday, November 18 off for MVP Youth Retreat. If minimum enrollment is not achieved, Pastor Karol will be here. Approved Pastor Karol's request to have Chris Schilling speak on Veteran's Day (November 11). Pastor Karol will preside over rest of service. There will be no additional cost for guest speaker since Chris is preaching on behalf of the military. Approved request to roll over one week of unused vacation time to 2019.
- Quick Books (2006) software crashed and new software has been installed.
- In August, Pastor Karol made 9 home/hospital/ nursing home visits, had 5 conversations with church family members, and sent 4 cards. Made one home communion visit with Deacon Tanya Best. Congregational activities: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), committee meetings, Brunch w/our college students and parents, Roy Pneuman Memorial Service, Youth Group, and Fall Officers' Retreat - Sharing God's Love: Evangelism, Hospitality, and Church Growth. Presbytery activities: High School Retreat Planning Team (2 meetings) Worship Planning Team, and New Pastors' Gathering. Community engagement activities: attended "Unsinkable Molly Brown", led worship at Mennonite Memorial Home (31 in attendance), BAMA, Bluffton University Church Fair with Lin Rumer and Julia Szabo, BPC hosting Community Meal at Senior Center, Sunset Drive Neighborhood Picnic, and Church/event information shared with ONU students. Noted that an anonymous donor covered the costs of the cups for college students. Pastor Karol has been nominated to serve on MVP Commissioned Ruling Elders Committee. Approved September 24-30 as Continuing Education to attend Stewardship Kaleidoscope Conference in St. Louis. Approved November 5-10 vacation time - has been nominated to serve on the Louisville Seminary Alum Board of Directors.
- Presently the only identifying signage for our church is on the far corner of the lot. Session and New Beginnings discussed possibilities of additional signage. Discussed revised church signs created by Fultz signs sign for front to be centered under stained glass window in landscape area, office sign, and sign for rear of building. Now in the final revision process.
- Talked with Jessie Blackburn twice concerning status of alley/handicap entrance. Expect contractor to work on alley in next two weeks.



The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration.

The first celebration of World Communion Sunday occurred in 1933. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed. Here at Blufton Presbyterian Church, our table is the table of Christ, open to Christians from all denominations and from all around the world. It is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.





Proclaim the Peace of Christ

"So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near." Ephesians 2:14-17

The letter to the Ephesians tells us that Jesus came to proclaim a peace that is universal. While the earthly ministry of Jesus was in a specific age and place, the peace he shared is limited by neither time nor geography. As followers of Christ, our call to witness and work for peace begins in our own neighborhoods and extends to the ends of the earth. It is a demanding call, but it is one that Presbyterians at all levels of the church are seeking to follow. The Peace & Global Witness Offering exists to support the holistic and wideranging witness of the whole church.

50 percent of the funds collected through this offering are deployed by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to join the peacemaking efforts of church partners all over the globe. Another 25 percent goes to the Presbytery and the Synod for peacemaking work in the region. BPC, through the leadership of session and the mission committee, can decide how to use the final 25 percent of the offering.

This year, we will be supporting Ian Vellenga and Jhanderys Dotel-Vellenga serving in Nicaragua with the Council of Protestant Churches in Nicaragua (CEPAD), which works to improve the lives of economically impoverished communities by promoting justice and peace. We join these monetary gifts with our prayers for peace and our work for justice.

The Peace & Global Witness Offering sustains a witness in many forms and at every level of the PC (USA), but all are bound together in Christ. Together we are a living proclamation of the peace we know in Christ, who puts an end to hostilities and speaks peace to those near and far. May the God of Peace open the generosity in our hearts to join with Christians all over the country on World Communion Sunday, October 7, in response to the Peace & Global Witness Offering.

FOR EVER AND EVER

The Stewardship and Finance committee has decided to place a periodic article in the newsletter encouraging our members to make estate plans and to consider leaving a bequest for the benefit of the church. We have two reasons for raising the subject.

The first reason is that everyone should have a will. If you don't have a will, any assets that you have accumulated at the time of your death will be distributed according to the laws of the State of Ohio under the supervision of the Probate Court. If you have or are the custodian of minor children, their care will, similarly, be determined, not by you, but by the Probate Court. If you are convinced of nothing else than that you should see an attorney and make a will, we will have achieved our first goal. And, you will have done yourself and your heirs an immense favor.

Our second goal is to encourage you to remember the church when you write your will. We enjoy the church that previous generations established and maintained here in Bluffton. We have an obligation to see that future generations have the same opportunity. It is an important witness to our friends and families about how important our faith and the church are in our lives. A bequest that helps ensure the financial viability of our congregation is one of the few opportunities we have toward achieving personal immortality and assuring the church's survival to witness to God's sustaining and eternal love.
