Highlights of August's Session Meeting

- From Called Meeting in June Our church is required to cover 100% of moving expenses for pastor exact expense to be agreed upon when PNC and pastor negotiate a salary. Motion approved to request up to \$3,000 for moving expenses. If higher amount is needed then session will be consulted. Approved to increase PNC expense line in budget to allow for travel expenses for 2 neutral pulpits expects travel expenses to be \$2,000 \$2,300. PNC member will be making the arrangements for airline reservations, car rental, and hotel.
- From Called Meeting in July Approved to call a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, August 6 following morning worship service to elect an elder to complete the unexpired elder term. Sarah Brauen, chair of PNC, reported that PNC (Sarah Brauen, Don Carroll, Carole Enneking, Sarah Gillen, Lori Schmidt, Dave Sycks, Megan Sycks, George Stultz, and Diane Winebar) had reviewed Personal Information Forms from over 60 candidates who were matched with our church or sent self-referrals. Committee pursued 15 of these with 2 expressing an interest and still available.

The committee had multiple Skype interviews with the final two candidates and invited each for a Neutral Pulpit which was held in July on back-to-back weekends. Neutral pulpit weekends included: 4 group meals with PNC; exploring Bluffton shops and Farmer's Market on their own; guided tour of Bluffton, manse, and church; meeting with COM representatives; morning breakfast at Ottawa before service; neutral pulpit at Ottawa Presbyterian; and formal interview at our church. PNC met and all were in favor of offering the position to the Rev. Karol Farris. Proposed terms of call were negotiated between PNC and Pastor Karol. Approved calling a Congregational Meeting on August 6 following worship, to extend a call to Rev. Karol Farris to serve as Installed Pastor of Bluffton Presbyterian Church pending approval of the congregation.

- Liaison group (Dick McGarrity, Tenna Rhonemus, and Lori Schmidt) met with leaders in early July to discuss arrangements. Bluffton Preschool would like us to use their materials for nursery. Our items have been stored in tubs in basement – with a few larger items being stored at manse. Insurance policy has been increased. Open House held on August 7 - well attended - including Pastor Karol and several of our members. They will be using basement as gathering place for parents to drop off. They are using our small plastic red chairs/hexagonal shaped tables. Bulletin board in basement purchased for their announcements. Plastic folding tables to be used for Sunday school have purchased/stored in basement by piano. Cleaning supplies will no longer be kept under restroom sinks. Preschool Sign will be placed in mulched area. They provide soap, paper towels for use. Orientation is August 29 with classes starting on September 6. Tenna Rhonemus is on their board and attends monthly meetings.
- Mailing sent out to church family with biographical information and proposed terms of call for Rev. Karol Farris. Meet and Greet held on August 5 at the Brauen's. Pastor Karol led service on August 6; congregational meeting held and affirmed calling her as our Installed Pastor. On Sunday/Monday she made four visits to shut-ins/members, met with Susan Meier, and attended Preschool Open House. Karol is packing in North Carolina with pods to be picked up on Friday. Will be held in Lima until August 24 when delivered at manse. Pastor Karol will return to unload on 28. First day in Office is September 6. She is working on date for Installation in September/October.
- Meeting called to examine and approve two candidates for ordination – Ben Shaw (Ottawa) and Laine Sipes (associate at Toledo Christ) was held in Toledo in July. Approved commissioning Julie Fogle as CRE at McComb. At September's meeting in Adrian, Michigan, Pastor Dave's retirement will be recognized and Pastor Karol will be welcomed. Congregation is welcome to attend.

- Permission given to Pastor Dave to park car at manse several days in June. Pastor Dave officiated at Memorial Service for Bob Angus. Deacons served funeral dinner. Approved to decline request from Gideons to speak in September. Following items approved electronically: In June approved increasing PNC line to allow for two neutral pulpits. In July approved request to install central air in office/library area bid of \$2,770 from M+R with the money from Evans' estate to be used. In August approved moving bid from Allied for \$3,356. When Karol contacted them they were no longer available. Using UHaul Pods estimate was around \$2,500.
- In August, approved request from BAMA to • use church lawn on Saturday, September 23 for community worship service from 10-12. BAMA is creating banners for each church, home church can use throughout the year and then BAMA uses at community events. Emergency Pastoral Coverage was provided by Kevin Mohr and Tim Wilmetti in Julyeach made one visit. Wanda Stopher covered first week in August and Ben Shaw (Ottawa) will cover rest of the month. Clerk will send thank you letters to each. Approved receiving Sue and Dave Van Eman as members by Letter of Transfer from Bluffton First United Methodist.
- Central air conditioning has been installed in • office/library area. Looking into options for weed/feed service for church/manse. Also looking into options for combining manse with church for snow removal. Following work has been done at the manse - painted garage door, painted kitchen, painted kitchen cabinets and bathroom cabinets, flooring installed in kitchen/bathroom, new tub/surround installed, new dishwasher installed, new light fixtures installed, windows cleaned, major work/mulching on landscaping, and front exterior door/screen door installed. Trim is being painted for woodwork. Kitchen countertop, back splash, and door to garage yet to be installed. Main bathroom needs dry walled and painted.

Approved purchasing new washer/dryer if the ones stored in the garage for five years do not work. Pastor Karol will be contacted about microwave.

- Community VBS held at English Lutheran Church in July was big success – 125-150 kids each night. Our church was responsible for the 40+ preschoolers.
- Betsey Angus was elected to fill unexpired term of elder. She will be installed on September 17 by Pastor Karol.
- Approved serving Communion on September 10 – Pastor Karol's first Sunday.
- Pastor Dave's retirement celebration was on June 11 and was well attended Love gift amounted to \$1,481. Little Pantry will be installed in the next month.
- Approved selling extra unused pulpit chair and room air conditioners on Bluffton Garage Sale.

BPC Manse

Thank you to all who have donated their time and talents for working at the manse this summer! While some of the work was completed by an outside contractor, our members donated many hours, which in turn lowered the cost for this renovation project. Manse renovation project included the following - Installing new front door and kitchen door; painting garage door and outside window frames; new dishwasher, washer, dryer, and microwave; replacing outdated light fixtures, smoke alarms, and carbon monoxide detector; painting kitchen and bathroom cabinets and installing new hardware; painting walls and ceilings in kitchen and bathroom; installing laminated countertop in kitchen; installing backsplash tile in kitchen; vinyl flooring in kitchen and bathroom; installing new sink and faucet in kitchen; installing ceiling fan in great room; removing wall in bathroom and replacing tub and surround which had been leaking; repairing ceiling dry wall in basement from leak in bathroom; installing GFCI outlets in bathrooms and kitchen; power washing the deck/porch; landscaping work and mulching; cleaning closets, cupboards, windows, bathroom, and appliances; hanging curtains; vacuuming carpets and cleaning wood flooring; and hanging new shutters.

Once all the work has been completed and Pastor Karol has chance to unpack, we will have an Open House at the manse so all can see the renovations which have been done this summer and two years ago when new carpeting was installed in bedrooms, wood laminated flooring in great room and hallway, and bedrooms and great room were painted.

Several unused/outdated items from the church/manse were sold via Bluffton Garage Sale Online with the money returned to the church – three room air conditioners, pot rack, light fixtures, pulpit chair. Other items were donated to ReStore.

Special thanks to Lynda Best, Cathy Carroll, and Jodi Brauen who coordinated these much needed renovations – Pastor Karol appreciates everyone's efforts!

Dear Friends and Colleagues in ministry:

On August 15, 2009, I arrived in Maumee Valley Presbytery to accept your invitation to share in ministry. I expected that the term would be short – two years. However, you and the Holy Spirit had other plans in play and eight years have flown by. For me, these years have been full and abundant. We have faced some very difficult times. We have enjoyed some amazing reconciliations and celebrations. Personally, I have flourished among you. There is work still to do.

However, the time has come for me to retire from active ministry. I have asked the Personnel Committee and Council to bring a motion to the Presbytery meeting on November 14, 2017, at First Presbyterian Church of Napoleon to make that request official effective February 28, 2018.

As many of you know, my oldest stepdaughter, Amy Snedeker, died two years ago. At that time, it became crystal clear to me that I wanted to be free to be with my family. My plans are initially to move in March to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, to be with my father in his final days. After he dies, I will move to Chicago to be with my grandchildren and their parents. I will be claiming the title of "Theater Geek" and want to visit a Regional Theater in all 50 states.

I have had the privilege of loving my work in ministry almost every single day. These past eight years have been among the happiest times of my professional life and I am very, very grateful to God for all of you. There will be time ahead to reflect, confess, celebrate, and let go. For now, I wanted to give the Presbytery adequate time to make this transition smoothly.

You have been to me a sign of the Reign of God on this earth. I share the sentiments of the Apostle Paul, "I am thankful for your partnership in the Gospel from the first day until now". (Philippians 1:5)
