Pastor's Letter

What we learned from the book of Ruth:

Throughout August, our weekly sermon series and Word in the World discussion group focused on Ruth, a short book of four chapters tucked away in the Hebrew Bible between Judges and Samuel. It is a story vaguely familiar to many, with the most well-known verse being: "Where you go, I will go, where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God" – words commonly shared at weddings, though initially spoken by daughter-in-law to mother-in-law.

Even such a concise story as this provided more than enough material for consideration and inspiration each week. One ever-present theme is loyalty. Ruth, a foreigner from Moab, expresses this loyalty to Naomi when she insists on accompanying her on the long journey to Bethlehem and volunteers to glean in the fields so that these two widows might survive. She abandons what might be best for her own future and instead pursues a marriage that would ensure the legacy of her husband's family, through the redemption of land and through an heir who would inherit it. In the end, she and Boaz bear a child, who in effect becomes Naomi's son, an heir to her husband Elimelech and her son Mahlon, Ruth's first husband.

From a series of unfortunate events to fortunate ones, Ruth finds refuge from danger and engages in risky business as she fulfills her vow to Naomi. God's role is not explicit in every moment of the narrative, yet seems to be present on the margins, subtly guiding the characters, providing a way through difficult circumstances. God's activity in our lives is like that too, at times. When we experience a chance encounter with someone who instantly connects with us, when we don't know how we can go on and then we receive an extraordinary gift, when we realize what great joy there is in offering ourselves to serve the needs of others. And as Christians, we rejoice in the extraordinary gift of redemption available to us through Jesus of Nazareth born in Bethlehem, a descendant of David, a descendant of Ruth. As Ruth showed selfless loyalty to Naomi, so we are called to demonstrate selfless loyalty to Christ our redeemer.

For further reading on the story of Ruth, I recommend the book *Finding God in the Margins: The Book of Ruth* by Carolyn Custis James.

This fall, you are invited to the weekly Word in the World discussions with Pastor Karol. Join us any time you are free on a Wednesday from 9:00 to 10:00 AM at the Twisted Whisk Café. We enjoy connecting God's word to today's world! We will meet each Wednesday in September, EXCEPT September 26.

Highlights of August's Session Meeting

- Approved expanding wireless internet access throughout the church building, awarding the project to JB Networks with a quote of \$568. Approved request from Sycks to borrow tent. Approved request from Hursey family to borrow tables/tent August 23-25 to use at a yard sale.
- Mid-Am facilities came and tried to clean sanctuary fans and speaker covers, however their equipment was unable to complete the job. Will try to clean the fans ourselves and contact House of Hindenach for suggestions on the speaker covers. The freezer, door, and excess wood have been removed from the manse garage. Mulching and weeding was competed at the manse. Stains have appeared from ceiling in hallway by preschool area – will contact Shuck's who installed the roof for their thoughts. Approved to pay up to \$600 for Thompson Cleaning to clean carpet, chairs, and pews in sanctuary. Approved to have First Klass Lawn Care provide fall treatment for yards at church and manse.
- CD (12 month \$100,000) at Citizen's National Bank will be maturing in September.
 Approved to reinvest at Citizens provided the rate is comparable with Edward Jones. If rate is not comparable, then approved to invest this money with Edward Jones.
- The Board of Pensions is requiring churches to submit pastor's salary information by October 12, which is earlier than previously. Communication with MVP appears that information about recommended raises and minimum line item amounts will be approved at September's Meeting. Personnel and Stewardship & Finance will work together with Pastor Karol to make financial recommendations. Approved calling a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, September 23 following morning worship service for approving the Pastor's Terms of Call for 2019.

- Donated \$100 of local mission money for community "National Night Out" – members of church family also volunteered.
- The projector for visual display boards appears to be working better now that it sits on a cooling mat. Tenna Rhonemus will be pulpit supply on September 2 when Pastor Karol is on vacation.
- In June/July Pastor Karol made 7 home/ hospital/nursing home visits, made 2 home communion visits with Deacon Laura From, and had 10 conversations with members of church family. On August 5, led Worship w/ Communion at Maple Crest (21 residents attended) with Deacon Dave Van Eman. Congregational activities: Word in the World discussion group (weekly), Pool Party dinner at Gillen's, Family Promise at St. Mary's Liturgical Dance rehearsal, 2 VBS Craft parties, outdoor worship service, Church Picnic at Brauen's, Pastor Relations Committee, and committee meetings. Presbytery activity: High School Retreat Planning meeting and New Pastors' Gathering. Community Engagement activities: 2 BAMA Meetings, walker for community VBS, and attended National Night Out. Pastor Karol will be taking vacation August 27 through September 2, including Sunday, September 2 and Continuing Education September 24 through 30, including Sunday, September 30 to attend Stewardship Kaleidoscope Conference in St. Louis. Shared that starting in September regular office hours will be Monday 2:00 to 5:00, Tuesday 9:00 to 2:00, Wednesday 10:00 to noon, and by appointment. Her usual time off will be Friday afternoon and Saturday. Approved to allow Pastor Karol to spend up to \$250 (from marketing line item in budget) for promotional materials (possibly mug with church name) to be used as gifts at the Bluffton University Church Fair.
- Lynda Best will talk with village administrator Jessie Blackburn to get status of alley restoration, as well as share our concern that we expect access to handicap ramp be permanent (vs. present stones) by winter.

Presently, the only identifying signage for our church is on the far corner of the lot. Session and New Beginnings discussed possibilities of additional signage. Preliminary sketches for outdoor signage from Fultz were discussed at length. Consensus was that we are interested in front and back sign to be similar style white with church name and logo. Front sign with posts (possibly 3ft by 6ft) will be centered in the landscape area in front of the large sanctuary window on Main Street. Back sign (possibly 2ft by 4ft) to be mounted on brick on back of office - centered between end of building and window - hopefully not flush on wall but with spacers to be able to seal brick. Hope to have final sketch and price at September meeting for Session to give final approval.

Deacons Report

- A heart-felt thank you to everyone who chose the name of a homebound member on August 5. Those whom you chose will be blessed to receive your card, note, or visit in the coming month. Our next Share the Spirit event will be held in November.
- The Community Meal is set for September 6. We will be serving Chicken Jumbo over rice a favorite recipe from Ben Miracle. With his assistance, as well as other church members, we will be providing and enjoying a tasty meal with our community.
