The Supermarket as Sin



I feel like a supermarket tabloid, trolling for your attention with outrageous headlines, when what I really need to speak about is stewardship. But really, it will make sense, if you bear with me. But first, two vignettes.

Scene 1

It is 1985, I have never gardened, and I am walking through the supermarket. And, something made me think of beets. (Okay, it's strange, but it was thirty years ago). And I turned to my friend and said, "Where do beets come from?" What I meant was "What is a beet, a fruit or a vegetable?" I hadn't even thought of it being a root. My friend said, without missing a beat, "Cans". The point being: I was so removed from the truth of food, and my friend only knew food from a supermarket.



Scene 2

It is 2005, I have gardened, but more importantly I now live on "the farm". We are harvesting 3 rows of sweet potatoes. This year we got 8 bushels. Now the year before, we got 2 bushels. The same person planted and tended. The weather was not significantly different. But in a normal year you got 2, and this year we got 8. Sometimes there is abundance. Sometimes there is not.

Now let's get to the SIN. I mean the lie. Supermarkets lie about food. They lie about where it comes from, they lie about seasons, they lie about the risk and fragility of growing. They lie about what food looks like (Grade A extra fancy).

The bins are always full. But plants vary in their productivity. The bins are always full, when plants are seasonal and only grow in certain climates. Oranges in winter? Apples from Chile? Grapes from South Africa? Kiwi! Kiwi from New Zealand! That's the opposite side of the world! I don't mean to be a curmudgeon about international commerce, but what is the cost to the environment of shipping perishable fruit halfway around the world? (To learn more about the specifics of shipping Kiwi, Google "Kiwi shipping TIS").

When there is a drought in Ohio, do we see any faltering of food supply? No, because our food comes from California, Georgia, Florida, and last year's wheat Harvest in Kansas. Now, the supermarket reduces anxiety. We don't worry about food. There it is, the bins are full: Grade A extra fancy. But we should worry about trucking!



We are recipients of **God's blessing**. We are blessed by the abundance of the earth, the work, the industry of others; and we are a part of a national and international family. But we are blind. **We are blind** to God's creative power, the work of others, to the infrastructure and cooperation of nation and international.

The root of stewardship is God's blessing and creation. But we miss it. We don't see fragility, interdependence, cooperation, or God's blessing. Not to be harsh, but the supermarket is selling an un-truth. And we buy it!

We are completely dependent on God's blessing but we miss it. When you go to the market, use different eyes!

Before the next newsletter

Before you see the next newsletter, we will have brought our stewardship season to a close and celebrated Thanksgiving. Advent will have begun. The church will be decked out! So don't take time to blink. Because before you blink twice Christmas will be here and New Year's too. (They are on Sunday this year!)

Plans are made. And we are now running to get there before it passes us. **And be careful**, lest your holy day holidays become a frantic chase and consumption.

This is a meaningful tradition when you think about it. During our coming in and going out, the Prayer Box will be a visible reminder that our church family cares for one another and offers support.

Highlights of October's Session Meeting

Claralice Circle (and Dave) hosted MVP's
Presbyterian Women Fall Gathering on
October 1. Proceeds of \$97 were given to
Building Restoration Fund. Mission money
will be donated to Bluffton Food Pantry.

Approved request by Devon/Jenna Kisor to be placed on "other" list. Approved request from Terry Mullenhour to use church on these dates to set up/take down Blaze of Lights display on Saturday: November 5, November 12, and January 7. Terry is securing proof of insurance. Approved request from Tom Edwards to borrow tables/chairs for neighborhood gathering in September. Approved request by Owen Ziessler to place display on manse lawn during Christmas season. Letter from Monmouth College was shared - Pastor Dave will share information with Chaplain at Bluffton University. Approved via email to allow Montgomery/ Henry wedding to use church facilities on October 1.

- First Mennonite contacted us asking us to switch January 2017 Community Meal dates with them and we agreed. BPC will now serve on January 5.
- Fred Rodabaugh (Reams Display) will be placing outdoor electrical boxes in the ground at the end of each side of the tube running under the sidewalk. Schuck's has repaired the opening under the church roof which squirrels had been using – part of Building Restoration Project. Drain pipes have been placed on exterior of rear of church so downspouts run to catch basin. Approved \$345 bid from Tree Tech for the following – remove two stumps at church, remove two stumps at manse, and trim pine tree branches close to manse. Village of Bluffton replaced one section of sidewalk – charged \$168. Hanging bulbs (sanctuary -18) were replaced. Approved spending up to \$1500 for Wendell Badertscher to replace window in manse, replace front door at manse, reset locks at manse, install storm door includes materials and 10-12 hours of labor.

- On December 11, Youth Group will lead worship. Approved allowing youth to serve communion on November 6 in conjunction with their Sunday School curriculum.
- Approved that, as of November 1, we switch to Church Mutual for our insurance – lower premiums for similar coverage as Guide One. Does include professional liability.
- Approved that our 25% of Peacemaking Offering be sent to Doctors Without Borders for work with Syrian Refugees and relief work in Haiti after hurricane. Making arrangements for helping with evening meal for Family Promise when hosted by Emmanuel UCC and St. Mary's in October. Asking members to make "magic pillow quilts" which will be distributed to our Adopt-a-Family, Family Promise, or Bluffton Community Assistance. Asking for help setting up Blaze of Lights display on November 5 and 12.
- In honor of Pastor Appreciation Month, Pastor Dave was given gift card to the Mustard Seed from church.
- During the month, Pastor Dave led two
 worship services at church, one worship
 service at Mennonite Home, visitations to
 homebound members at home/care facilities –
 many received communion, officiated at
 Andrew Montgomery and Melisha Henry
 wedding, COM work for MVP, finished
 teaching Adult Sunday School class,
 committee meetings, attended professional
 liability training.
- Approved to mount 2 video display boards and projector on rear wall by light switches. Will participate in Trick or Treat on October 27. Claralice Circle plans to go caroling in December.





Dear Church Family,

Our congregation is almost like one big family. We've welcomed newcomers to our community. Our members include several three-generation families. Our church has been an integral part of the Bluffton community for many years. Many of our most cherished memories have been nurtured in this family – infant baptisms, weddings, memorial services for loved ones, Christmas Eve and Easter services. We are the beneficiaries of a precious legacy built up by generations of faithful members who have contributed their energy, talents, and treasure to the mission and ministry of our church.

But the church faces significant challenges. We are moving to meet these challenges with new life. Evidence of this new life is the Ignite fellowship service group, formation of an additional small group, new mission projects and new mission groups including Family Promise.
